Fr Ben writes...

Following Fr Felix's departure from the parish, I write to ask for your prayers and support as I take on my new enhanced role.

Please do not hesitate to be in touch with me, I will be the first port of call for most matters that you might have usually contacted Fr Felix. The quickest way to get hold of me is by text message (07492 930704) or email (chalkspringscurate@outlook.com). Do also let me know if someone is in need of pastoral care, I am not a mind reader!

The slight difference is that there will be no one in the parishes to which I report. Fr Paul Seaman has been appointed to be my acting training incumbent, and along with the Director of Apostolic Life (on behalf of Bishop Martin) is responsible for my training and formation. I will meet with them for supervision and support as required, and there may be times when I need to get advice before responding to a particular issue.

I will always be available to you for priestly ministry, but I do want to manage your expectations. My revised role description has no less than 20 extra bullet points of things I will be responsible for in the coming months, on top of my existing responsibilities, which are many. It is very likely I will be asking for more help with things from the wider congregation.

Given my increased workload, it will not be possible for me to attend every event in both parishes, and I would ask for your kindness when this is not possible.

I will endeavour to keep Monday as a rest day as far as possible, and there may be times when I need to be away from the parish for training, meetings, retreat etc. An important part of my formation is to nourish and develop my spiritual life.

I would like to encourage a greater working together between the parishes of South Lancing and Sompting, and Lancing with Coombes. I think this is imperative to make this an attractive job prospect for any potential new incumbent.

I look forward to sharing with my colleagues Fr Michael, Fr Gerald, and Fr David in caring for your sacramental and pastoral needs during the vacancy and hopefully in growing spiritually and numerically. This is certainly not a time to stop attending Church!

I pray that God will raise up a Faithful and Holy Priest to care for his people in Lancing, Sompting, and Coombes (and that it doesn't take too long!)

Walsingham Pilgrimage 2025

New Archdeacon of Chichester appointed

The Bishop of Chichester, Dr Martin Warner has appointed The Reverend Dr Tom Carpenter, Parish Priest of Holy Trinity and St Luke's Southport, as the next Archdeacon of Chichester

Dr Carpenter studied theology in Oxford and trained for ordination at the College of the Resurrection, Mirfield. He was a curate in his home diocese of Sheffield.

He is presently a vicar in Southport, where he faced the outpouring of grief and violence that followed the murder of three young girls at their dance class.

He was recently appointed Rural Dean of North Meols, taking responsibility for supporting his neighbours as the Diocese of Liverpool addresses the serious challenges of finance and mission that face large parts of the Church of England.

In response to his appointment, Dr Carpenter asked for the prayers of the priests and people of the archdeaconry, "that I will have the grace to be a good servant'.

He also asks for prayers for his wife Judith, who works for the Church Army, and their two-week-old baby son, Joseph, "whose interests are eating, sleeping and nocturnal squealing".

He succeeds Luke Irvine-Capel who was recently appointed as Bishop of Richborough.

Bishop Martin said: "I am delighted that Fr Tom Carpenter has accepted the invitation to serve as the next Archdeacon of Chichester. He brings pastoral experience drawn from areas of deprivation in the north of England. But the existence of poverty and disadvantage also demands attention in our own coastal towns and rural communities.

"He also brings a stable spiritual life, shaped by the monastic

community at Mirfield. He combines a northern sense of humour with the gift of making readily accessible a profound grasp of Christian thought that spans the centuries.

The Bishop of Horsham, The Rt Revd Ruth Bushyager, with whom the new archdeacon will work closely, said today: "I am so looking forward to working with Tom as we serve the churches and communities of the Chichester Archdeaconry and Diocese."

A date for licensing and installation will be announced later. Other recent diocesan appointments:

- The Reverend Russell Dewhurst, currently Acting Archdeacon of Chichester to be Archdeacon of Hastings,
- The Reverend Emma Ham-Riche, currently Priest in Charge of St John the Evangelist Preston, Brighton to be also non-stipendiary Associate Archdeacon for Diversity and Inclusion,
- The Reverend Canon Dr Earl Collins, currently Vicar of St John the Baptist, Hove, and Officer for Continuing Ministerial Development to be Canon Chancellor of Chichester Cathedral.

Chichester 950 celebrations continue

Tickets are now on sale for the spectacular finale of the Cathedral's 950th anniversary celebrations - a dazzling light and sound installation by the internationally renowned artistic collaboration Luxmuralis, taking place from 24 - 31 October.

This never-before-seen immersive light experience will transform every corner of the Cathedral - from the ancient Nave to the South Transept - into a radiant canvas of colour, story and sound. Using thousands of images from the Cathedral's and West Sussex Record Office's archives, the installation will invite visitors on a journey through nine and a half centuries of history, celebrating the Cathedral's enduring role as a place of inspiration, faith and reflection.

The Cathedral has also unveiled its newest installation, Fish950, which comprises over 950 fish-shaped artworks, contributed by 33 schools across East and West Sussex.

The fish holds deep significance in Christianity - from its early use as a symbol of faith to the post-resurrection story in John 21:6, where the disciples, following Jesus' instruction, cast their nets and made a miraculous catch.

The symbolism is also uniquely local. In the 7th century, St Wilfrid, who founded the See of Selsey, taught the people of Sussex how to fish with nets – a gesture of both spiritual and practical generosity that laid the foundations for the Christian community in this region. In 1075, the seat of the bishopric moved from Selsey to Chichester, and construction began on the Cathedral which, 950 years on, stands as a beacon of faith, spirituality and community.

The installation will remain on display until Sunday 31 August.

The Religion, Rebellion and Reformation exhibition which shares the story of the Christian faith in Sussex, revealed through people, events and treasures, from 1075 to the present day will continue to run until 15 November 2025. This features fascinating artefacts from across the Diocese of Chichester, spanning East and West Sussex. Each object reveals remarkable moments and people from history. It includes the delicate bronze Medieval crucifix, unearthed in Coombes churchyard.
