When the weather warms up and the azaleas start showing off, Charleston comes alive in the best way. Music fills the parks, art hits the streets, and good food and better company are never hard to find. Whether you're a festival regular or just looking for an excuse to get outside, here's your go-to guide for spring events around the Lowcountry that are totally worth adding to the calendar.

Cooper River Bridge Run

The One Everyone Does (Even If They "Don't Run")

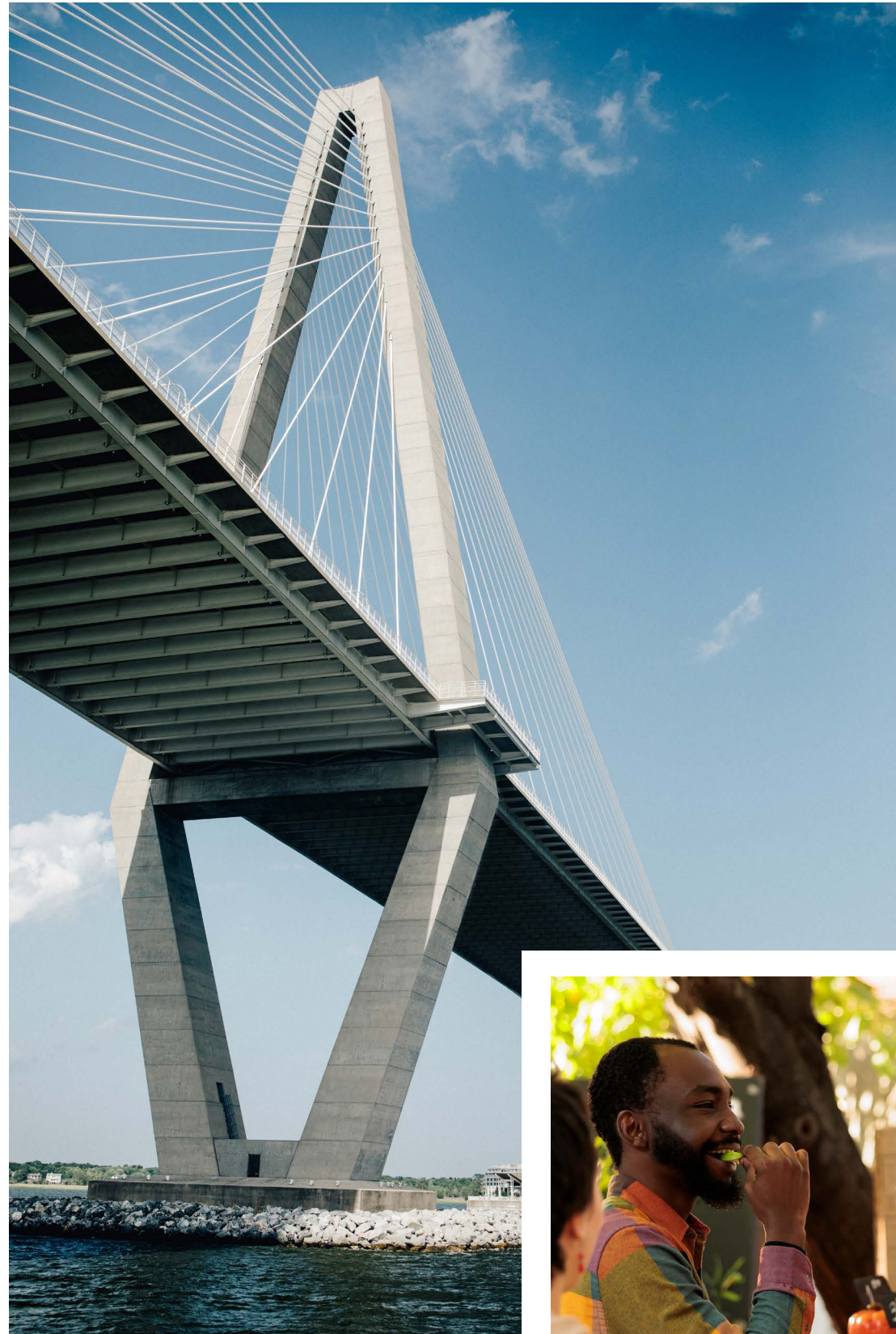
Every April, tens of thousands of locals and out-of-towners lace up and "Get Over It"—literally. The Cooper River Bridge Run is Charleston's iconic 10K, stretching from Mount Pleasant over the Ravenel Bridge and finishing in the heart of downtown. The views are unbeatable, the energy is electric, and whether you're running, walking, or just tagging along for the after-party, it's an experience you won't forget.

Pro Tip: Skip the traffic nightmare—take the free shuttle from downtown to the starting line in Mount Pleasant. Trust me, it's a lifesaver.

Southeastern Wildlife Exposition (SEWE)

Where Art, Animals, and the Outdoors Collide

SEWE kicks off the spring energy, even though it technical-



ly happens in February. It's like a giant love letter to the outdoors, packed with wildlife art, dog demos, chef tastings, and plenty of family fun. Whether you're an outdoorsy type or just here for the food and furry friends, SEWE delivers.

Pro Tip: Try to snag a spot at Wild Cuisine—it's where top chefs cook up wild game and local dishes you won't find on your average menu.



Charleston Wine + Food Festival

A Foodie Wonderland by the Water

Five glorious days. World-class chefs. Endless wine. The Charleston Wine + Food Festival is a total flavor fest. From elegant waterfront dinners to cozy wine tastings and high-energy pop-up events, this is where Charleston's food scene shows off—and you're invited. The Culinary Village is the heartbeat of it all, packed with live demos, killer bites, and good vibes.

Pro Tip: Go beyond the Village—book a smaller tasting or workshop for up-close time with the chefs. Way more intimate, and honestly, some of the best bites happen there.

Spoletto Festival USA & Piccolo Spoleto

High Culture Meets Local Creativity

Spoletto Festival USA is Charleston's cultural Super Bowl. For 17 days, artists from around the world take over the city with

opera, dance, music, and theater. Meanwhile, Piccolo Spoleto runs alongside it—think local artists, indie musicians, street performers, and pop-up galleries. Together, they turn Charleston into one big, buzzing creative playground.

Pro Tip: Get the festival pass to save on multiple shows—and show up early for outdoor events if you want a solid seat. Many Piccolo events are free, which means they fill up fast.

Lowcountry Strawberry Festival (Boone Hall Plantation)

Strawberries, Rides, and Family Fun Galore

This is not just a strawberry-picking day—it's a full-blown festival with rides, music, petting zoos, pig races, and the best dang strawberry shortcake you've ever had. Held each spring at Boone Hall, this one's perfect for families or anyone who's secretly a big kid at heart.

Pro Tip: Bring a cooler for your hand-picked strawberries, and go early if you want to avoid the mid-day crowds. You'll thank yourself later.

Summerville Flowertown Festival

Azaleas, Art, and a Little Slice of Small-Town Heaven

Every April, Summerville turns into a floral dreamscape during the Flowertown Festival. Thousands of azaleas, wisteria, and dogwoods bloom just in time for one of the Southeast's largest arts and crafts festivals. The vibe is relaxed, friendly, and full of charm—kind of like Summerville itself.

Pro Tip: Hit it on Friday if you want to beat the weekend crowds, and plan for parking—shuttles are your best friend here.

The Holy City in Bloom: A Journey Through Charleston's Botanic Beauty

There's nothing quite like spring in Charleston. The air smells sweeter, the streets feel sunnier, and everywhere you look—something's blooming. From grand, historic estates to tucked-away neighborhood gardens, our Holy City puts on a show this time of year. And let me tell you—it's a good one.

Whether you're a longtime local or just getting to know Charleston, this guide is your excuse to slow down, look around, and fall in love with spring all over again.

Magnolia Plantation: Where History Meets Full Bloom

Let's start with a classic—Magnolia Plantation. If you've lived here for more than five minutes, you've probably heard someone gush about it, and for good reason. This place is the real deal. The gardens here have been blooming since 1676 (that's 350 years!), and they're still stealing the show.

tography—or just want a new profile pic—this is your spot.

Neighborhood Strolls & Hidden Gems

Sure, the big plantations are amazing, but don't sleep on the little gardens hiding in plain sight. One of my favorite places to explore in spring is Cannonborough-Elliottborough. This neighborhood has major charm, and the front yards are like the flower exhibit in a museum.

Also worth the drive: the Angel Oak on Johns Island. It's over 400 years old and just... majestic. The wildflowers surrounding it in spring add a touch of magic to an already unforgettable spot.

Springtime Events You'll Want on Your Calendar

If you really want to lean into Charleston's garden season, don't miss the Charleston Historic House and Garden Tour. You'll get a rare peek behind the gates of some of the city's most beautiful homes and see gardens that usually stay hidden from view. It's like Charleston's version of MTV Cribs—if Cribs had more azaleas.

And for a pop of color (and the perfect bouquet), swing by the Charleston Flower Market at Marion Square. Local growers and florists bring their best blooms, and you'll walk out with your hands full and your heart happy.

Spring here isn't just a season—it's a full-on celebration of beauty, nature, and all the little things that make Charleston, well, Charleston. So take the detour. Stop to smell the jasmine. Kayak Through the Marshes

In Charleston, food isn't just sustenance—it's a soulful celebration of culture, community, and heritage. Rooted in history and elevated by generations of tradition, Southern cuisine tells the story of a region rich in flavor, resilience, and creativity. From time-honored recipes passed down through families to innovative takes on Lowcountry classics, every bite offers a glimpse into the past and a taste of the present. As spring and summer breathe new life into the Holy City, it's the perfect time to explore the culinary legends that define the South—and discover where you can savor them at their very best right here in Charleston.

Fried Chicken: Crispy, Golden Southern Comfort

Few dishes capture the essence of Southern cooking like fried chicken.

Hot, crispy, and impossibly juicy—Southern fried chicken is a rite of passage. Sometimes spiced with a hint of cayenne or kissed with buttermilk tang, it's comfort food at its finest. Whether it's served with a side of mac 'n' cheese or atop a savory Belgian waffle, it never fails to hit the spot.

Where to try it: Bertha's Kitchen in North Charleston serves up old-school, deep-fried perfection that locals swear by. Their soul food classics have been passed down through generations. Simple, flavorful, and served with red rice or okra soup, it tastes like Sunday supper at Grandma's. For a more modern twist, head to Leon's Oyster Shop, where their buttermilk-brined bird is a thing of beauty.

Shrimp & Grits: A Lowcountry Love Story

Originally a humble fisherman's breakfast, shrimp and grits has transformed into a Southern culinary star. Plump, sweet shrimp are sautéed in a rich gravy or buttery pan sauce and then spooned over a bed of creamy, stone-ground grits. The result? A profoundly comforting dish that's both rustic and refined.

Where to try it: At Husk, chef-driven innovation meets Southern heritage. Their shrimp and grits change with the seasons but always showcase local ingredients and Lowcountry flair. Over at The Glass Onion, you'll find a heartier, rustic version, of-

ten with smoky andouille sausage and tomato gravy.

She-Crab Soup: Charleston's Signature Spoonfull

This luxurious bisque—packed with crab meat, roe, cream, and a splash of sherry—was reportedly created in Charleston in the early 1900s and is a staple of fine Southern dining today. Rich, elegant, and unmistakably coastal, this dish is Charleston in a bowl.

Where to try it: 82 Queen has perfected this Charleston classic, serving up a version that's been awarded and adored for decades. Each spoonful is silky, savory, and laced with local lore.

Lowcountry Boil: The Ultimate Coastal Feast

A celebration of land and sea, the Lowcountry boil (also called Frogmore Stew) is a one-pot party. Shrimp, smoked sausage, corn on the cob, and red potatoes are boiled with Old Bay and lemon until perfectly tender, then traditionally drained and piled high on a newspaper-covered table. It's messy, communal, and absolutely delicious.

Where to try it: Bowens Island Restaurant is where locals and visitors alike gather for the real deal. Sitting dockside with a plate of steaming seafood, a cold drink, and

the sun setting over the marsh—that's Charleston living at its finest.

Biscuits: Fluffy Pillows of Southern Joy

A great Southern biscuit is a small miracle: buttery, tender, and lightly crisped on the outside, with flaky layers inside that beg to be pulled apart. They're the cornerstone of breakfast, the perfect sandwich base, or a canvas for sausage gravy or honey butter. Biscuits are a Southern staple that borders on sacred.

Where to try it: Callie's Hot Little Biscuit has built a cult following for a reason. Grab a few fresh from the oven and taste why these handheld delights are breakfast (or brunch) royalty. Choose from traditional buttermilk, sharp cheddar, or savory country ham varieties—all baked fresh in small batches and served warm with spreads that turn a simple snack into something unforgettable.

Charleston's cuisine is more than the sum of its ingredients. It's a tribute to the region's heritage—Gullah traditions, African and Caribbean influences, French techniques, and deep Southern roots. Whether you're diving into a bowl of she-crab soup or picking apart a Lowcountry boil under the sun, every meal here tells a story. So, let your taste buds be your tour guide & enjoy the ride!

Banana Pudding

Creamy, nostalgic, and irresistibly sweet, this banana pudding is a timeless Southern favorite that never goes out of style. Perfect for potlucks, family dinners, or anytime you need a crowd-pleasing dessert, it layers smooth vanilla pudding with fresh bananas and vanilla wafers for a comforting treat that feels like home in every bite.

Ingredients

2 cups cold milk
1 (5 ounce) package instant vanilla pudding mix
1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
1 tablespoon vanilla extract
1 (12 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed
1 (16 ounce) package vanilla wafers
14 small bananas, sliced or to taste

Recipe

Place milk and pudding mix in a large bowl; beat with a whisk for 2 minutes. Blend in condensed milk until smooth. Stir in vanilla, then fold in whipped topping.

Layer wafers, banana slices, and pudding mixture in a glass serving bowl.

For best results, chill pudding in the refrigerator for at least an hour before serving. When ready to serve top with extra crushed wafers.

The Lowcountry has always known how to raise a glass. From the historic piazzas of Charleston to the breezy porches of coastal cottages, sipping a cocktail is as much about ritual as it is refreshment. But not just any cocktail will do. Down here, we prefer our drinks with a story—seasoned with history, stirred with charm, and served with a generous pour of Southern hospitality.



So, let's take a toast-worthy tour through some of the most beloved classic Lowcountry libations—each one a flavorful nod to tradition, culture, and the easygoing elegance of life by the water.

Charleston Tea

What's in it: Sweet tea vodka, lemonade, peach schnapps

Few drinks scream "Southern refreshment" quite like this crowd favorite. It combines two of the South's most beloved staples—sweet tea and peaches—into a cocktail that's as easygoing as a Sunday afternoon. The peach schnapps adds just enough sweetness to play off the tartness of the lemonade, while the sweet tea vodka anchors it in familiar Southern flavor.

Lowcountry Lemonade

What's in it: Vodka, fresh lemonade, sweet tea

Garnished with a lemon wheel, this cocktail is the perfect front-porch companion. The Lowcountry Lemonade is light, citrusy, and effortlessly drinkable. What sets it apart is its balance—the tartness of the lemonade balances the gentle bitterness of the tea, all rounded out with a vodka kick. Some bartenders even add fresh herbs or muddled berries for a seasonal twist.

Southern Comfort Old Fashioned

What's in it: Southern Comfort, bitters, sugar, orange twist

A Southern spin on the classic cocktail, the Southern Comfort Old Fashioned swaps traditional whiskey for Southern Comfort for a richer, fruitier, and slightly spiced base. It's the cocktail equivalent of a Southern gentleman—smooth, charming, and just a touch bold. The orange twist adds brightness and balance to every sip.

Pimm's Cup

What's in it: Pimm's No. 1, lemonade (or ginger ale), cucumber, mint, fresh fruit



Imported from Britain but beloved in Charleston, the Pimm's Cup is light, herbal, and garden-fresh. It's a favorite for summer weddings, garden parties, and beachside brunches. Often served with cucumber, strawberries, oranges, and mint, it's as much a feast for the eyes as it is for the palate.

Sazerac

What's in it: Rye whiskey, absinthe rinse, sugar cube, Peychaud's bitters

Though it hails from New Orleans, the Sazerac has made its mark in Charleston's more classic cocktail bars. This spirit-forward drink is for those who appreciate bold flavors: the peppery bite of rye, the licorice warmth of absinthe, and the deep spice of Peychaud's bitters.

Mint Julep

What's in it: Bourbon, mint, sugar, crushed ice

No cocktail is more synonymous with the South than the Mint Julep. Served in a frosty silver cup and topped with a fragrant bouquet of mint, it's a must-sip during warm months—or anytime you're feeling fancy. Crushed ice chills it to perfection while the sugar and mint soften the bourbon's heat.

Hurricane

What's in it: Light and dark rum, passion fruit juice, orange juice, lime juice, grenadine

Loud, fruity, and fun, the Hurricane isn't for the faint of heart. Originally

created in New Orleans as a way to use up surplus rum, it's since become a Southern icon. Charleston's take often adds fresh juices to elevate the drink beyond its rowdy roots.

Bellini

What's in it: Peach purée, Prosecco

Born in Venice, the Bellini has become a seasonal star in Charleston, especially during peach season. Simple, sparkling, and sweet, this cocktail is a bubbly, elegant treat. The key is using fresh, ripe peaches blended into a smooth purée, topped with bubbly Prosecco for a refreshing brunch-ready cocktail.

Local Craft Beer Cocktails

What's in them: Varies—think local IPAs or lagers mixed with spirits, citrus, and creative mixers

With Charleston's craft beer boom in full swing, bartenders are finding inventive ways to incorporate local brews into their cocktail menus. Whether it's a beer-based shandy with citrus vodka or a porter-spiked bourbon cocktail, these unique, fizzy concoctions are quickly becoming a staple that celebrates homegrown flavor.

Downtown Charleston (The Peninsula)

West Ashley

This area's perfect for families or anyone looking to get a little more space without sacrificing convenience. You'll find marsh views, walking trails, and a cool little pocket called Avondale that's home to shops, bars, and brunch spots.

Why locals love it: Close to downtown, without the downtown price tag.

James Island

Energy: Easygoing, salty air, beach meets backyard



James Island is perfectly tucked between Downtown Charleston and Folly Beach, which means you're just minutes from city life and saltwater. It's got a laid-back, locals-only kind of vibe, with strong community roots, great schools, and tons of green space. James Island County Park is a favorite for everything from festivals to family bike rides. And if you love being on the water, it's a go-to for boaters, kayakers, and anyone chasing that easy Lowcountry lifestyle.

Fun fact: James Island is famous for its annual Festival of Lights during the holiday season.

Mount Pleasant

Energy: Polished, family-first, a little fancy (in a good way)

Mount P (as locals call it) is the suburb that checks all the boxes: great schools, shopping, waterfront parks, and neighborhoods that look like movie sets. Towne Centre's got everything you need, and Shem Creek is the go-to spot for sunset seafood with a view. It's popular for a reason—people move here and never want to leave.

Pro move: Paddleboard at Shem Creek, then grab a drink while watching the boats roll in.

North Charleston (Park Circle)

Energy: Up-and-coming, artsy, full of surprises

North Charleston is having a moment, especially around Park Circle. It's young, creative, and more affordable than most parts of the city. You'll find breweries, coffee shops, food trucks, and a tight-knit, come-as-you-are vibe. Artists, entrepreneurs, and first-time buyers are flocking here for the energy—and the value.

Don't miss: Firefly Distillery and the North Charleston Performing Arts Center bring a dose of local flavor and entertainment.

Johns Island

Energy: Peaceful, spacious, country-coastal hybrid

If you're dreaming of big yards, old oak trees, and maybe even some chickens or a garden, Johns Island might be your paradise. It's growing fast, but it's still got that rural charm—with farms, horses, and wide-open skies. You're close to both Folly Beach and the Angel Oak Tree, which is basically the wise old grandfather of Charleston.

Heads up: You'll trade a bit of drive time for serenity, but it's worth it.

Summerville

Energy: Small-town heart, big on community

About 30 minutes from downtown, Summerville is where front porches and sweet tea reign supreme. It's peaceful, affordable, and packed with charm—especially in the historic downtown. It's a favorite for families, retirees, and anyone looking to slow things down a notch while still having access to good schools, parks, and restaurants.

Local legend: They say Summerville is the birthplace of sweet tea. Come for the tea, stay for the community.

Short-Term vs. Long-Term Rentals: Know the Playbook

Charleston has a hot tourism market and a growing local population—so you've got options. But each path comes with its own pros, cons, and red tape.

Short-Term Rentals (STRs)

High cash flow potential, but Charleston doesn't mess around when it comes to regulations. Only certain zones allow it, and you'll need to jump through some hoops to get approved.

Heads up: Don't assume you can Airbnb just anywhere. Always check STR zoning maps and city ordinances before you buy or reach out to a Real Estate Advisor at Contact@LivelyCharleston.com

Long-Term Rentals

More stable, less hands-on, and ideal for folks who want to build wealth without a ton of management stress. College-adjacent neighborhoods (near The Citadel or CofC) are especially reliable.

Pro tip: Not local? Hire a legitimate property manager. They'll handle the headaches, screen tenants, and keep you compliant.

Flipping with Finesse

This city is full of older homes and hidden gems—but flipping in Charleston isn't like flipping in the suburbs. You need local knowledge, the right team, and respect for historic quirks.

Look in areas on the rise (examples: Wagener Terrace, North Central, parts of West Ashley). Be very aware of renovation complexity, especially in historic districts. Always check for flood zone status before making an offer.

Understanding ROI in the Holy City

Over the last decade plus, the Charleston investment market has shown strong appreciation with healthy cash flow potential—if you buy smart.

Cap Rate Goals: For long-term rentals, shoot for a cap rate between 6–8%.

Appreciation: Hyper local, but certain neighborhoods have seen big time annual growth.

Tax Talk: SC gives nice breaks for owner-occupied homes, but investment properties are taxed differently. Talk to a local CPA who specializes in real estate.

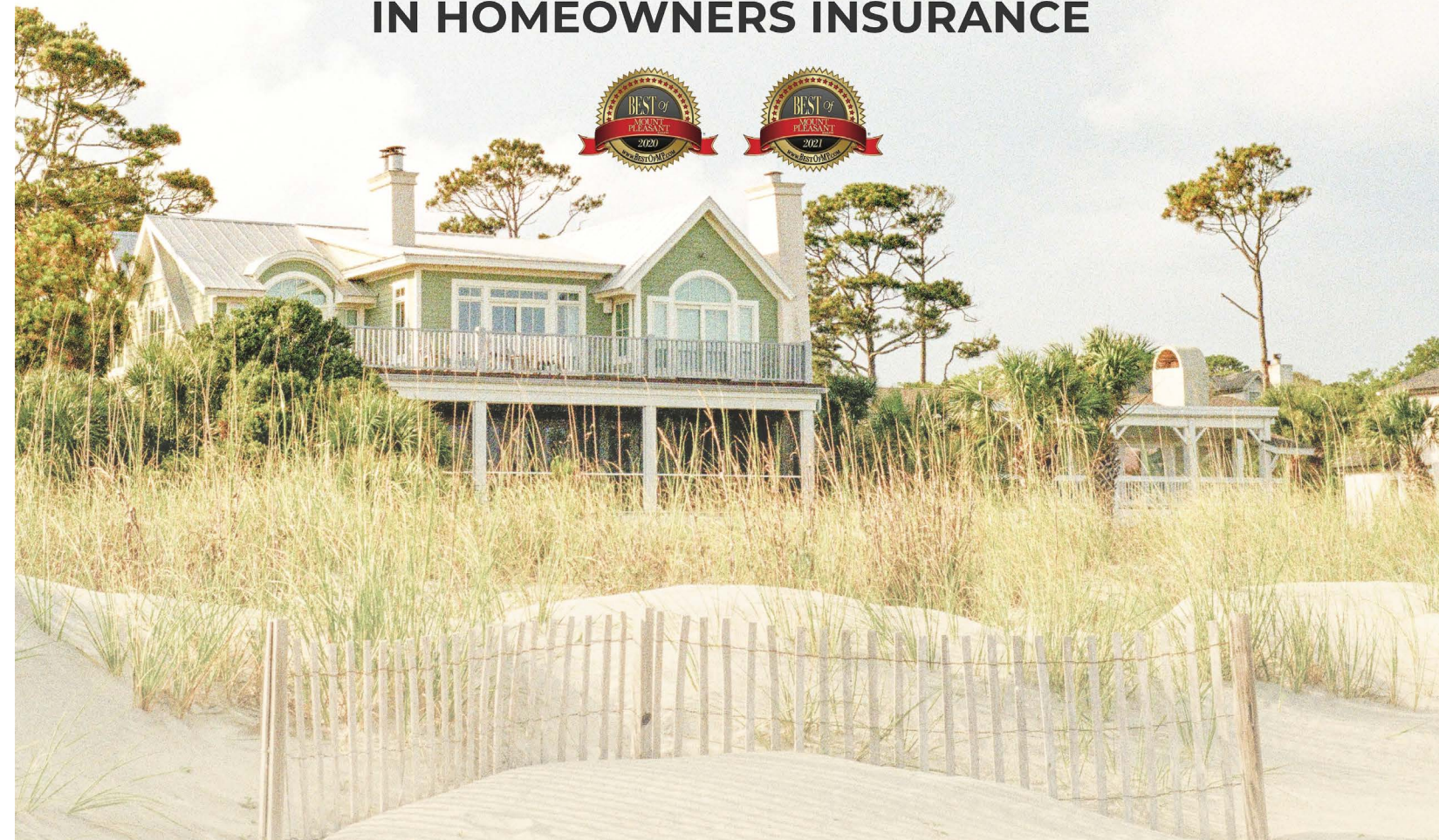

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
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
