Growth since 2014



- ▶ A 30% increase in emergency calls
- ▶ Increase in residential development
- ▶ An addition of 4 senior living/senior care facilities.
- ▶ Current plans for further development
- ▶ Large increase in medical office buildings
- ▶ Increase in hotels/large retail



Challenges in Service



- ▶ With community growth came a higher demand on all of our primary services(emergency response, fire prevention, fire education, hydrant maintenance, fire investigation).
- ▶ A significant loss of part time employees (69%) - created the need for more full time positions (15 over 5 years)
- ▶ Increasing costs:
 - ▶ Personnel
 - ▶ Medical supplies
 - ▶ Fuel and maintenance supplies
- ▶ Ongoing fluctuation of part time employees



Challenges in Service



- ▶ Station 107 at 2280 Sylved only has one crew (3 personnel)
- ▶ This was sufficient back in 2014, but with higher demands for service, it adds unnecessary strain and delay to our community response.

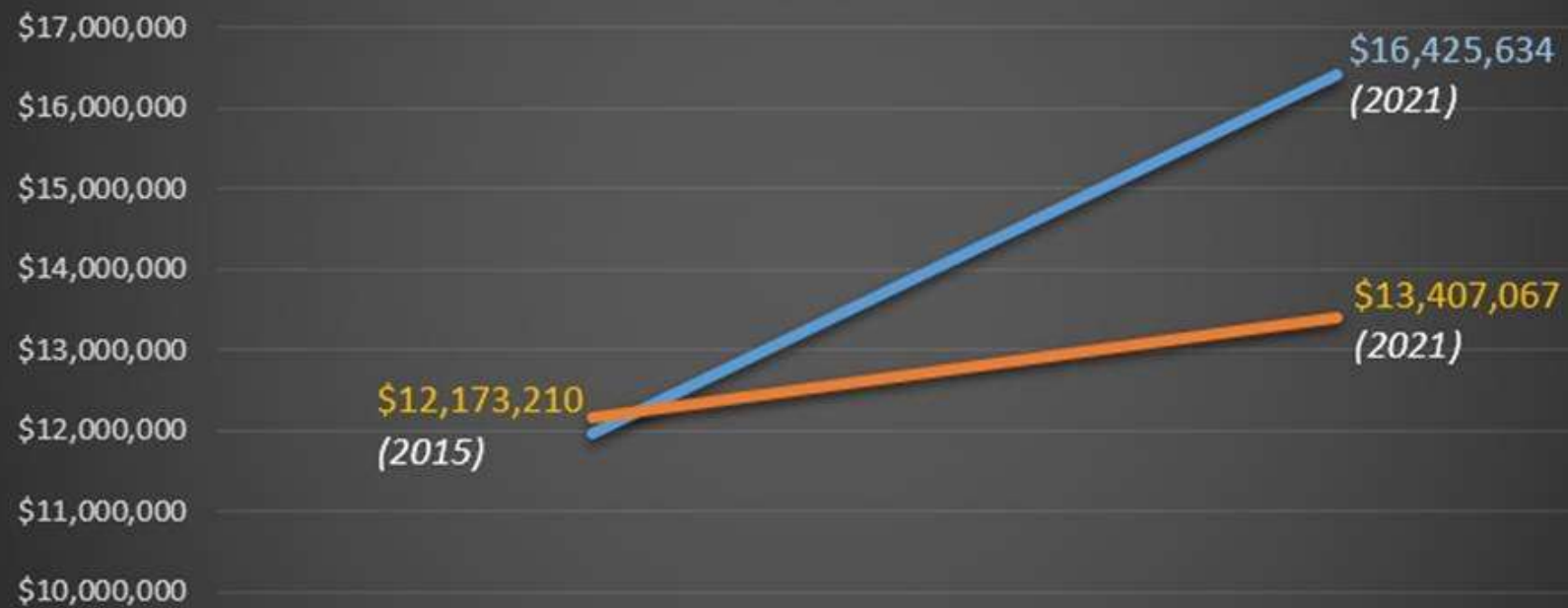
Operational Needs



- ▶ Hire three additional full time firefighter/paramedics
- ▶ Increase staffing at Station 107 to accommodate two simultaneous crews (Fire crew and EMS crew).
- ▶ Continue enacting the vision of quality service delivery and support to our community, while maintaining a fiscally responsible strategy.
