REACHING HEARTS BOUND BY PRISON WALLS



In 2025, HeartBound Ministries marked its 22nd year of service, continuing its mission to provide Christ-centered programming to individuals and families impacted by incarceration. Throughout the year, HeartBound volunteers and staff delivered classes and events at 23 adult and juvenile correctional facilities and 9 churches across Georgia, Tennessee, and Mississippi. Programs offered included guitar, art, horticulture, financial literacy, Little Readers, mentoring, parenting, seminary education, leadership development, beekeeping, cooking, quilting, choir, pickleball, aquaponics, book club, and 561 hours of free trauma counseling sessions, addressing both practical skills and emotional healing.

Beyond measurable outcomes, HeartBound witnessed profound personal transformation throughout the year. Former program participants returned to facilities to serve and encourage those still incarcerated, families were reunited and strengthened, and recently released men and women received support securing housing and employment - reducing their likelihood of recidivism. Inside prison facilities, HeartBound established and maintained gardens that provided fresh produce, beautified institutional spaces, and served as tangible symbols of hope. One facility even received a Japanese maple tree, planted as a lasting reminder that growth and renewal are possible even in the most difficult environments.

Most notably, HeartBound's mission came full circle as three formerly incarcerated individuals - Fred (art), Eric (guitar), and Joe (beekeeping) - were employed as paid instructors through HeartBound-funded programming. Their leadership exemplifies the organization's commitment to restoration, reentry, and long-term transformation. HeartBound remains deeply grateful for its board members, volunteers, staff, ministry partners, and supporters, whose collective investment makes this work possible. As the organization looks toward 2026, it remains committed to loving others unconditionally, remembering those in prison, and extending hope to all who need it.
