ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

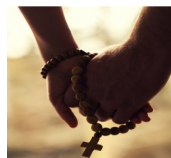


On the First Friday of the Month following the 9:00 am Mass there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Confession until 10:00 am at Saint Paul's.

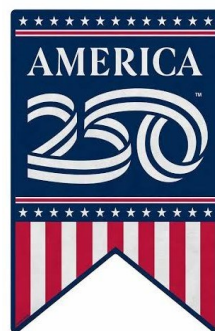
