How do we fast? When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two other smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence? Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

EDGE CLASS SUMMARY

Dear EDGE Families:

Thank you for bringing your children to EDGE! We are so grateful that all of our eligible students submitted their letters for Bishop Hennessey to be confirmed on May 4th! John personally delivered the letters this past Tuesday! Our collaborative has over sixty-six students being confirmed next month, including all of our 8th grade students for the first time!! As of May 4th, we will have successfully migrated confirmation from 11th grade to 8th grade and moving forward all students will be confirmed in 8th grade! This would not have been possible without the exceptional work of all our Core Team members and John Cusalito who has worked with all students to help them arrive at their confirmation with confidence and excitement! We also had others in the parish get special gifts for our Candidates and hopefully we will get additional support for our pilgrimage retreat to the National Shrine of Divine Mercy on April 26th! These students represent the future of our Church and they are an extraordinary group! Our EDGE students have hosted a dinner for the parish, two nights of Soup and Stations and this week they will be filling hundreds of eggs with candy for the Annual Easter Egg Roll at Saint Paul's.

This week's class focused on "redemption!" What better way to illustrate the power of redemption for all students than looking at the life of Carlo Acutis who will be canonized on April 27th! We started class with musical chairs, a class favorite. Then our readings that featured our Blessed Mother saying yes to God and the Angel! Even though her saying yes meant a life of joy and the great pain of losing her son, she is always with us as our model of saying "yes" to God and receiving His divine mercy. The videos included one short one about Carlo and another about how the Church considers someone for becoming a saint. A short teaching followed on Jesus as our redeemer. Then we worked on an "examination of conscience" that prepares us for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We went up into the church and learned about Adoration. Hopefully during Lent, you can find some time to spend in Adoration with your child. Last weekend all the Jubilee churches hosted 24 hours for the Lord and I had the opportunity to visit the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Salem. This is a beautiful shrine right in downtown Salem that has Mass each week in Polish. During this year of pilgrimage it is important to try to be a pilgrim especially during Lent or during Holy Week!

FAMILY REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What is something you learned about God throughout this Edge series?
- What is your favorite movie that has a redemption arc?
- How can we as a family celebrate the joy of our salvation in Christ?

We also want to encourage all for submitting their permission slips for the pilgrimage trip on April 26th. It is a great honor to travel this journey of faith with your children and everyone can learn from these students about saying yes to God!

The Last Supper



The account of the institution of the Eucharist may be found in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke as well as in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (see Mt 26:17-29; Mk 14:12-25; Lk 22:7-20; 1 Cor 11:23-26). Jesus chose the Passover feast as the time in which he would institute the Eucharist and would undergo his dying and rising (cf. CCC, nos. 1339-1340). With the institution of the Eucharist, Jesus gave the Passover its new and definitive meaning. He showed himself to be the High Priest of the New Covenant, offering himself as a perfect sacrifice to the Father. Jesus changed the bread and wine into his Body and Blood, given now as an offering for the salvation of all people.

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said,

"This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes. (1 Cor 11:23-26)

By the words "Do this in memory of me," Jesus commanded the Apostles and their successors to repeat his actions and words "until he comes again." From earliest times, the Church has remained faithful to this command. Particularly on Sunday, the day of Christ's Resurrection, the faithful has gathered for the Breaking of the Bread. This practice has continued unbroken for two thousand years right up to the present day.

In the Gospel of John, instead of an account of the institution

of the Eucharist, there is the narrative of the foot washing (Jn 13:1-20) at the beginning of the Last Supper, which sets the tone of humble service, exemplified by Christ and fulfilled in his death on the Cross. The Church has selected this Gospel for the Holy Thursday liturgy, highlighting Christ's teaching: "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do" (Jn 13:14-15).

Christ's Last Supper Discourse (Jn 14:1-17:26) reflects Eucharistic themes of divine love, a union with Christ as intimate as a branch is to a vine, and a priestly prayer for the Apostles and those who would believe through them.

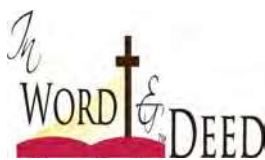

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Prayer services, reflections and art often focus on the seven last words of Christ. These efforts try to capture the suffering and the agony of body and soul that Jesus experienced. In seven words we hear the intensity and the weight of the battle between evil and good, sin and grace, death and life. It is a solemn reflection on the difficulty of the spiritual life we lead as followers of Jesus.

If some focus on His seven last words, we might also focus on His seven most difficult words: Take up your cross and follow me. In that short sentence, all the faithful find their mission and purpose in life, given at Baptism and sealed in Confirmation. We follow Jesus. Trusting in His promises, accepting the Holy Spirit, and with a willing mind and heart, we take up our cross. It is the battle of faith, the power of hope and the glory of love. Through struggle, suffering and even death, we choose to follow Christ as our life and our light.

Our final week of preparation for Easter is here and Palm Sunday is the time once again to take up the cross. In our own lives, we will live the Passion of Jesus. We struggle with the meaning of our life, the decisions we make, and the sins we commit. Never lose hope! The Lord knows the way. Just pick up your cross and follow Him.

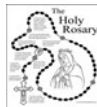

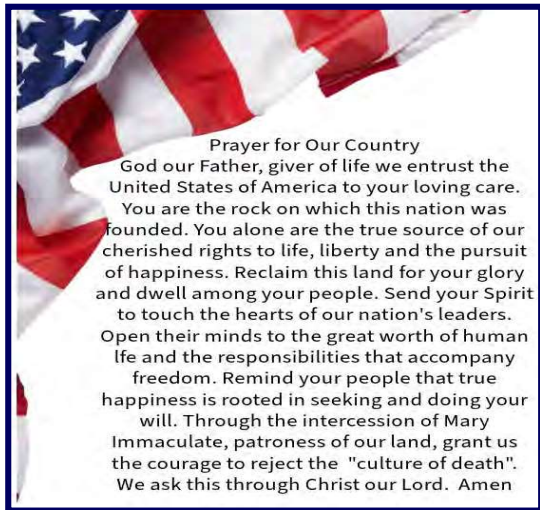


VOLUNTEER REQUEST FOR SOCIAL COMMITTEE

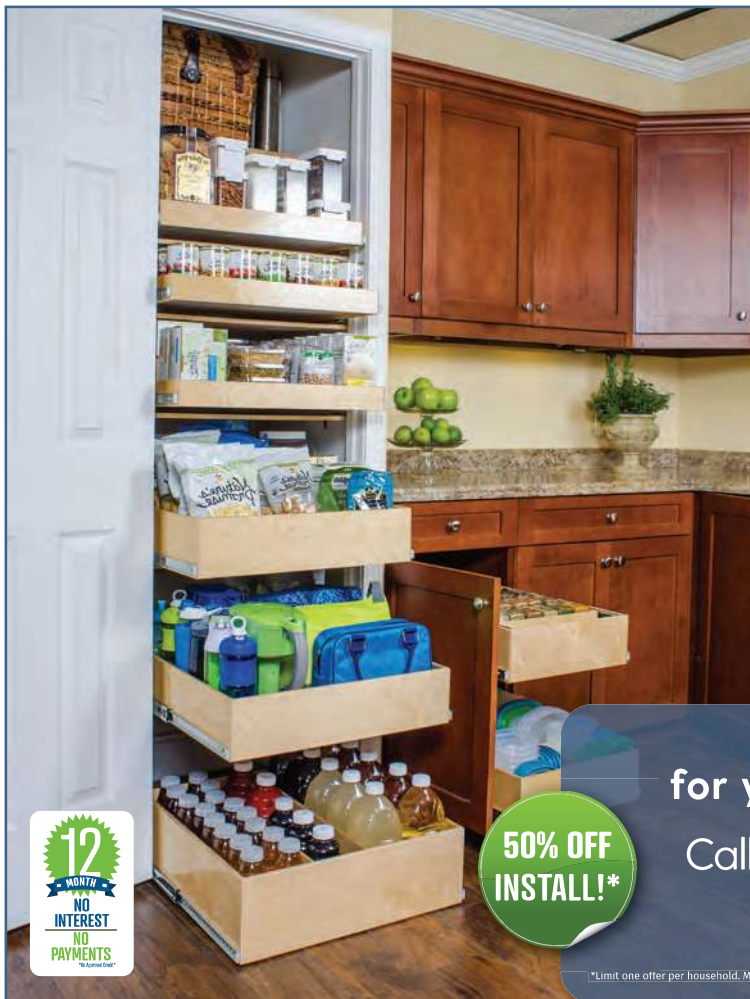

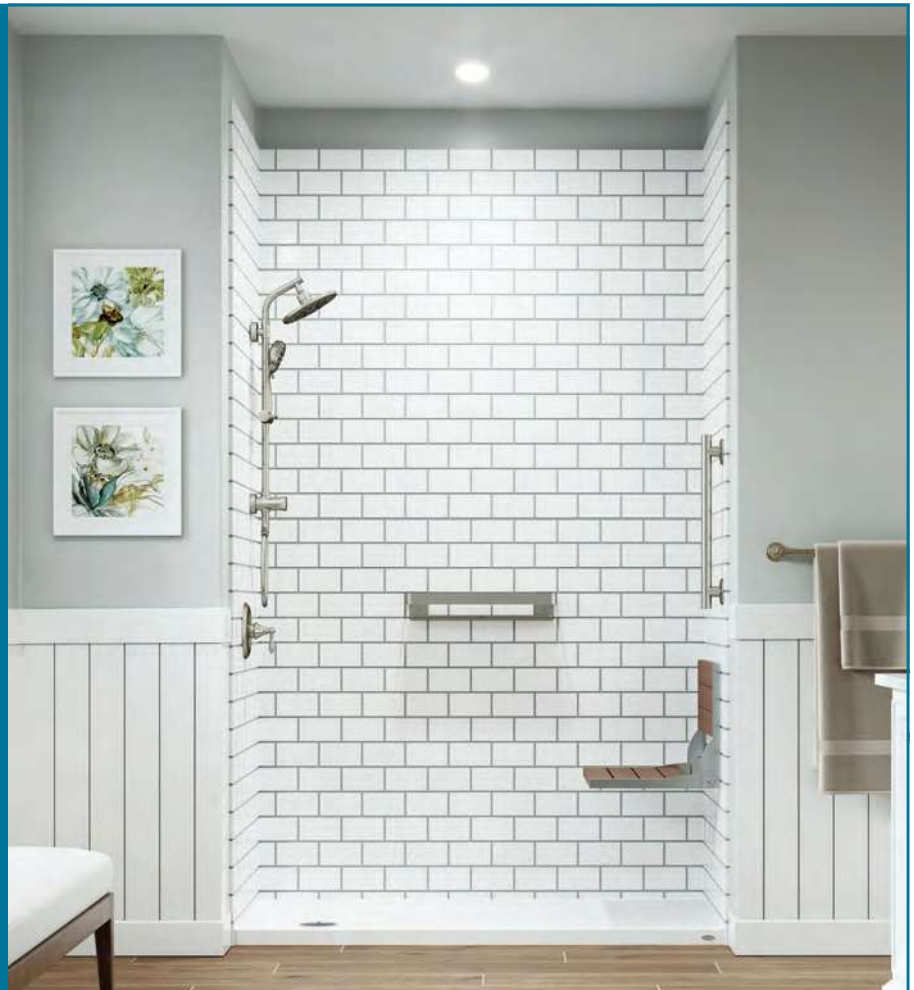

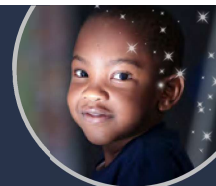
