Counseling the Doubtful Everyone has moments of doubt in their faith journey. Nevertheless, we should always remember that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life and turn to him along our way.

 Orient your response to Christ, who is
the Way, the Truth, and the Life.
 Follow Christ with the witness of
your life so that others may see God's
love revealed in your actions.
 Accompany a frend who is struggling with believing to join a parish

dealing with your friend's faith concern, and worship at Sunday Mass.

Instructing the Ignorant Learn about our faith and be open to talking with others about our beliefs. There is always something more to discover about our faith.

 Volunteer to help with religious education programs at your parish.
 Invite someone to go to mass with you this weekend.

Admonishing the Sinner Do not judge but be supportive in helping others find their way and cor-rect their mistakes. Together we can learn to walk more closely with Christ.

- Examples:
 In humility we must strive to create a culture that does not accept sin, while realizing that we all fall at times. Don't judge, but guide others towards the path of salvation (see Mt 7:1-2).
 When you correct someone, don't be arrogant. We are all in need of God's loving correction.

Comforting the Sorrowful Be open to listening and comforting those who are dealing with grief. Even if we aren't sure of the right words to say, our presence can make a big difference.

- Examples:

 Lend a listening ear to those going through a tough time.

 Make a home cooked meal for a friend who is facing a difficult time.

 Write a letter or send a card to someone who is suffering.

 A few moments of your day may make a lifetime of difference to someone who is going through a difficult time.

Forgiving Injuries
Forgiving others is difficult at times
because we do not have God's limit-less mercy and compassion. But Je-sus teaches us that we should forgive as God forgives, relying on him to help us show others the mercy of God.

- Examples:
 Let go of grudges.
- Let go of grudges.
 Saying sorry is something we learn as kids, but how often do we really mean it? Forgiveness transforms hearts and lives
- Participate in the Sacrament of Pen-

 Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Bearing Wrongs Patiently Do not be bitter about wrongs done against you. Place your hope in God so that you can endure the troubles of this world and face them with a compassionate spirit.

Divine Mercy Sunday

Second Sunday of Easter

"Jesus told Sr Faustina: 'Humanity will not find peace until it turns trustfully to divine mercy (Diary, p. 132). . . It is not a new message but can be considered a gift of special enlighten ment that helps us to relive the Gospel of Easter more intensely, to offer it as a ray of light to the men and women of our time." –St. John Paul II, Divine Mercy Sunday, 2000

In 1931, Jesus appeared to Sr. Faustina in Poland and expressed his desire for a feast cele-brating his mercy. The Feast of Mercy was to be on the Sunday after Easter and was to include a public blessing and liturgical veneration of His image with the inscription "Jesus, I trust in You. All priests were to proclaim God's great mercy on this day.

This promise of mercy has been affirmed by the Church, which has made Divine Mercy Sunday an occasion for receiving a plenary indulgence, "the remission before God of the temporal pun ishment due to sin whose guilt has already beer forgiven" (CCC, no. 1471). The plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions (Confession, Eucharist, prayer for the intentions of the pope, and complete detachment from sin, even venial sin). The faithful may either take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy in any church or chapel or recite the Our Father and Creed in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus.




The Easter Season

Easter isn't just a day, it's a whole season and etches all the way to the feast of Pentecost

At masses all through the Easter season, our usual practice of reading from the Old Testament is replaced be reading from the Acts of the Apostles. These readings tell the story of the church's earliest days, and the beginnings of our faith's spreading throughout the ancient world. These stories of heroism, controver-sies, persecutions and miracles all testify to the continued presence of the Risen Christ in the world, through the lives of his disciples, and the actions of the Holy Spirit.

All of this should be an encouragement and a sign of hope for us today. Despite war, violence, personal struggles, and an under-per-forming economy, God has not abandoned us, nor left us to our own devices. The risen savio is still with us. These 50 days of Easter ask us to reflect on his presence, and—even in the face of danger or fear—to live with joy.





Second Sunday of Easter-Year C

First Reading — Acts 5:12-16: The apostles, performing signs and wonders, gathered in Solomon's portico, held in high regard despite others' hesitance. Their number grew rapidly, and the sick were brought to them; even Peter's shadow was sought for healing. All who came were healed.

Responsorial Psalm — Psalm 118: Israel, Aaron's descend-ants, and the God-fearing proclaim God's enduring mercy. He answers in distress, providing strength and salvation. The rejected stone becomes the cornerstone, a marvelous act of the

Second Reading — Revelation 1:9-11A, 12-13, 17-19: John, exiled on Patmos for his faith, receives a vision from Jesus on the Lord's day. Instructed to write, he sees Christ among lampstands, falls down, but is reassured by Christ, the eternal, resurrected one holding keys to death and Hades.

Gospel - John 20:19-31: In a locked room, Jesus appeared to Cospie — Joint 2017-931: In a locked room, josses papeared in his disciples, offering peace and showing his wounds, which brought them joy. He empowered them with the Holy Spirit and the authority to forgive sims. Thomas, a beat initially, doubted their testimony. Later, Jesus appeared again, inviting Thomas to touch his wounds, leading to Thomas' declaration of faith. Jesus blessed future believers who wouldn't see yet believe. These events were recorded to affirm faith in Jesus a

Latherine was the 24th of 25 children of a Sienese dyer; her mystical experiences and raptures began at age 6. She refused to marry, and about 1367 joined the Third Order of St. Dominic. She attracted a like-minded group in Siena for prayer and good works and experienced the last five years to church unity and ending the scandal of rival papacies. Though she experienced the pain of the stigmata, it became visible only after her death at 33. And, in an odd division of relics, her body is in a Roman church, while her head is in a Sienese church. Named a doctor of the church in 1970, Catherine is a patron saint of Europe and Italy, and the patron of fire prevention, nurses and nursing.

PRESENCE

Giving God Our Full Attention

Have you ever had a conversation with someone and saw their eyes darting all around, paying attention to everything but you? Distraction is a reality for all of us. We want to be "in the moment," but find it hard to do so.

Why is that?

We could pin the blame on social media or the 24/7 news cycle. We know the battle for our attention is fierce, and it is big business.

These external forces can also impact our interior lives, making us less focused when we pray. We may get to Mass a few minutes early and yet find it difficult to still our minds. We may pray the rosary and forget which bead we are on. We may find that, in a holy hour, a few minutes of silence feels like an eternity.

There is no question that distraction is something we all wrestle with in prayer. In the previous column, we discussed the first habit of prayerful people, which is Passion and Pursuit.

The second habit, Presence, answers the question, "How can I give my full attention to God when I pray?"

To be more fully present to God, you must carve out a regular time for daily prayer. Don't rely on willpower alone,

as it will wax and wane depending on your physical energy or the number of items on your plate. By adding a bit of intention to your daily prayer time, you will be able to train your mind and heart, telling both that "this is prayer time." The rest of the day can wait. This habit can then be replicated at various times later in the day, recalling when you least expect it a word from Scripture or the awareness of God's presence.

Second, when you pray, share with God what's on your mind. Do this especially at the beginning of your prayer time. If it matters to you, it matters to God. Talk to the Lord about your anxieties and concerns. Simply hand them over to God, not withholding anything. This process gets these aspects of your life, albeit temporarily, off your mind so you can better pray with a sense of focus.

Finally, employ the power of a prayerful pause. Your prayer time may be filled with Bible reading, intercessory prayer or even the use of a journal. Give yourself permission to go slowly, daydream, look out the window and then gently return to prayer. Prayer is an experience of intimacy with God, of sharing your life with him.

In his book, The Five Habits of Prayerful People: A No-Excuses Guide to Strengthening Your Relationship with God (Ave Maria Press), Mike St. Pierre gives practical tips to build up your prayer life – one day at a time.






