



## **Edge Class Summary—Grades 6-8**

Dear EDGE Families,

This final Edge Night in the series on the Eucharist gave practical tips for sharing about the Eucharist with their friends, such as attend Mass together, pray at home and pray for others. The Edge Night began with a favorite family feud bible addition. Some of the questions are (1) what are the largest animal's on Noah's ark; (2) name the top biblical heros; (3) name the animals found the most through the bible and other questions. Volunteers read the class' scripture verses. This week's verse: "This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever." This was followed by our discussion of why the eucharist is life changing. The scripture verse gives the answer: We who believe in Jesus and eat the Eucharist will not die! We can go to Mass everyday in most parts of the world and receive the Eucharist - that is life changing. Whenever you feel overwhelmed, discouraged or sad - you can find a Mass and receive Jesus - an instant life changer. That means that our family and loved ones who eat the Eucharist also never die. We receive eternal life. We are all called to share this message with others.

We watched a silly Video <a href="https://youtu.be/FMLYBvmMbPE?si=lpJ5P1SF3yeUWdVx">https://youtu.be/FMLYBvmMbPE?si=lpJ5P1SF3yeUWdVx</a>.

Small groups created commercials (aka skits) about the Eucharist. We all wrote notes of encouragement for a young man who just finished Coast Guard training and is on his first assignment. One student wrote "you are a coast guard!" We listened to a Katy Nichol music video about praying for others and holding on. This young lady is so talented and if you are ever having a bad day pull up some of her songs on Youtube and she makes you feel better.

EDGE classes are finished for this semester - but now it is your turn - to act. Please attend Mass, there is a youth mass on December 3rd and encourage your student to attend with other students. Set up an ADVENT wreath and prepare for Christ's coming on Christmas. Keep Christ in Christmas and remember why and how he changed our lives. Our EDGE students after this series on the Eucharist are excited to go to Mass and they are excited to go to confession. Have them write notes to people of encouragement or Christmas greetings (they are great writers of notes). Pray before meals and pray the rosary for peace and for others. Practice selfless over selfish. Always remember that the Eucharist is life-changing because it means eternal life for us.

We were blessed with many miracles this semester. Two Mothers (Nancy and Maura) from our parish whose children are older came to help out with our Tuesday EDGE and one parent (Lauren) joined us. Three parents (Peter, Katherine and Tara) joined our Wednesday EDGE class. Eighth grader Parker Shea came to visit from England for two weeks of Edge classes. Joseph T. came to class on his birthday! Our students wrote notes to Pastor Brogan, Father Kiley, Father Lawlor and our new Coast Guard. We learned about how Ian miraculously recovered from cancer after we prayed for him with intersession from Blessed Carlo Acutis! On Wednesday night (the last night of class) all the students remained until 8:50 when class is over at 8:30 - they did not want to leave! Please let them share their faith with you - it is extraordinary!


