Nativity Crèche

In its present form, the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche for Christmas Eve of 1223.

The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on Christmas Eve or at another time:

Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is Godwith-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

WINTER STORM CANCELLATIONS

When there is inclement weather, there is concern for the safety of parishioners and visiting priests traveling to our parishes and our ability to clear the parking lot and walkways to make them safe and free of snow/ice. 
First Penance

4th Sunday of Advent - December 24, 2023

First Reading – 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8B-12, 14A, 16: "And when your time comes and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your heir after you, sprung from your loins, and I will make his kingdom firm."

fourth sunday of advent

LIGHT THE ADVENT WREATH

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit ... Come Lord Jesus, be our light! Help us to trust in you, as Joseph trusted in God.

■ READ THE GOSPEL for the Fourth Sunday of Advent (Cycle A) Matthew 1:18-24

"When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him ..."

REFLECT WITH A STORY

Joseph and Mary were engaged to be married when Joseph found out that Mary was going to have a baby. After hearing this news, Joseph decided to call off the

marriage. But an angel appeared to him in a dream and told him to stay with Mary and take care of her. The angel said the baby was God's son and should be named Jesus.

This was not at all what Joseph had planned! The angel's message was so unusual, and would require so much from him, that it would have been easier for Joseph to pretend he didn't hear it. Instead, he trusted God and did what the angel asked, even though it would change his life.

Like Joseph, a group of Dominican sisters in India had to change their plans in order to respond to God's call. They arrived in India in 1954, intent on opening a new hospital. But at that time, many men were losing their factory jobs, which meant that many women were looking for work so they could take care of their families. The Dominican sisters saw this, and instead of founding a hospital, they started St. Mary's, a sewing and embroidery center, where women could come and work, and be a part of a supportive community.

Because these nuns trusted in God's plan rather than sticking to their own, they were able to help Keechi, an Indian woman whose husband and older daughter had passed away. With the money she makes through sewing and embroidery, she is able to send her daughter, Reena, to school.

The Dominican sisters' example invites us to consider how God may be calling us—like he called Joseph—to trust in him enough to do things we wouldn't have necessarily planned for ourselves.

This week, practice this simple prayer each night before bed: "Jesus I trust in you."



At our local high school, a number of teachers reminded their students that class ended when the bell rang, not a few minutes beforehand. Students anticipated the end of class and began packing up their things, just when the teacher was making the most important point. Patience, even in the classroom, is a virtue.

The readings remind us that God fulfilled His promise to David when Gabriel announced to Mary that she had been chosen to be the mother of Jesus. Her response to the heavenly messenger was so simple, yet reflects a great faith and hope: "Let it be done to me as you say." It's a line that will be repeated thousands of times in Christmas plays, and in Advent hearts that want to do God's will.

Christmas is so close, but there is still time. Don't jump the gun and lose these last few days. Keep on preparing, searching for the special gift of grace that only comes this time of year. Find the way that you can also respond to the invitation given to you at Baptism, to be a person of faith, a child of God, and a witness to the power of the Gospel. Let it all be done to you as God said!


