ary, from Magdala in Galilee, was a disciple of Jesus who used her resources, or wealth, to help support him and his followers. The Gospel of Luke identifies Mary as the woman from whom Jesus cast out seven demons. The Gospels record that she was present at his crucifixion and burial. In all four Gospels, Mary was the first witness to the Resurrection and carried that news to the others. Because of this, St. Augustine called her "apostola postolorum," the apostle to the apostles. On June 3, 2016, Pope Francis raised her liturgical observance from a memorial to a feast—the same rank as the observances accorded to the apostles.

Hello again friends!

When it comes to our youth, the best thing that we can do as a parish is to support families as the primary religious educators of their children: we celebrate the Mass and sacraments, we accompany kids and their parents and encourage them to grow in love with God and the church, offer opportunities to learn about their faith, and try to foster encounters with Jesus through our programs and community life. I am blessed to know so many of you, but if we haven't yet met, I'm Elisa St. Clair, and I'll be directing our Religious Education and Faith Formation programs this year. But I'm only the lead learner — catechists are needed at every level to support one another and guide our kids through a year of learning and growing in faith.



In our Elementary program, it's currently a classroom style, where one or two teachers will have a small group of students. For Middle and High School, you'd be part of a team, helping to lead discussion and prayer in a small group, with the teaching done each week to the larger group. Catechists are needed at all levels, and the most important things you can bring are your love for God, and your love for our kids. What we most need are disciples — our youth need to see people who are living their faith, and who can share that faith with them.

In this pursuit—more workers are ALWAYS needed in the vineyard of the Lord! So, please prayerfully consider if God is calling you to help minister to our youth, and reach me at elisastclair@ipswichcatholics.org, or at the parish office, 978-356-3944, extension 28.

Our registration is open, and if you, or a family you know, have been away from faith formation after the challenges of the past few years— it's not too late! 
I'm looking forward to seeing your beautiful faces this year as we seek more deeply what it means to be disciples of Christ together!
