

# Propagation of the Faith Missionary Appeal—Next Weekend July 19 & 20

As part of the annual Missionary Co-Operative Program, Fr. Fredrick John Baptist Ndungu of the Archdiocese of Nyeri Kenya will speak at all our Masses next weekend about The Society of St. Peter Apostle, one of the four Pontifical Mission Societies represented here in the Archdiocese of Boston. Fr. Fredrick will share stories of his experiences of the mission Church, where seminaries are sometimes turning away young men who want to say "Yes!" to a call from God but cannot because of their own poverty and that of their diocese. Fr. Fredrick will help us build a spiritual connection to others whose daily lives may be very different from our own.

# 2025-2026 CORI PROCESS HAS BEGUN

The CORI process has begun for 2025-2026. For those who have been volunteering at Our Lady of Hope the new CORI forms are available on the rectory porch, exit tables in church and in the sacristy for you to take home and complete. Once completed, we need to verify your ID (driver's license or passport) in person. Not to overload Fr. Brogan at Mass, please stop by parish office and see Joanne DiNatale to verify your picture ID (license).

Volunteers include anyone who help in service of their time and talent at Our Lady of Hope. Volunteers are required to complete a CORI form EACH fiscal year. In addition, you must have completed the Protecting God's Children (PGC) Program and received the Archdiocesan Code of Conduct. If you are interested in volunteering, and have not volunteered during this past year; please call the rectory to receive a blue form for (NEW **VOLUNTEERS**) and read the notice to register for the Protecting God's Children in this bulletin to attend if you have not.

# **OCIA**

# (Order of Christan Initiation of Adults)

Are you or someone you know interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Perhaps you are thinking about what it means to be called to the Catholic way of life. The Church has a process called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) whereby adults can learn and discern whether to become Catholic Christians. The process leads an unbaptized adult to his or her baptism, usually at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. If the adult has been baptized in another Christian tradition, then the process prepares the person to be received into the Catholic Church by making a profession of faith as a Catholic. The process also prepares the way for someone who was baptized in the Catholic Church to receive First Holy Communion and Confirmation. 

A heartfelt thank you to the generous St. Paul couple, who wish to remain anonymous, for donating to St. Paul's our beautiful new ciborium handmade in Spain pictured below! Fortunately, Our Lady of Hope has in its possession a stunning ciborium that Fr. Brogan found in a closet at Our Lady's that has begun to be used recently.

# The Ciborium

In the Roman Catholic Church, the ciborium (plural ciboria) is a vessel used for the distribution of Holy Communion in church and for the reservation of the consecrated hosts in the tabernacle. The ciborium is for the Consecrated Bread/Host, the Chalice is for the Consecrated wine/Blood of Christ.

The shape of the ciborium resembles a chalice, but the cup or bowl is round/wider rather than oblong/conical. It has a cover surmounted by a cross or another Sacred design. The bottom of the cup should be a little raised at the center so that any remaining particles may be easily removed and to facilitate the purification.

The ciborium is often made of precious metals, but the interior of the cup must be always lined with gold as it is this that comes into direct contact with the Sacred Host.

The ciborium is blessed by a bishop or priest deputized by him, according to the form given in the Roman Ritual; it is not consecrated. Father Brogan blessed our new ciborium at the 9:30 Mass last Sunday.

Bonus info:

The ciborium is also synonymous with baldacchino as the domeshaped permanent canopy over a high altar, supported by columns and shaped like an inverted cup.


