


EASTER EGG HUNT

EDGE PROGRAM —ST PAUL

Dear EDGE Families;

The Edge Night began with a series of games themed around a beach resort. We had beach volleyball, limbo and the hula hoops! The teaching focused on what it means to commit to following Jesus and having a constant conversation with Jesus through prayer. We watched a video of a popular Christian singer Laura Diagle who describes her personal conversations with Jesus. Another video of hers with her amazing song that is particularly powerful for students! We spent some time with Scripture verses related to the virtue of joy. The Edge Night ended with prayers led by our amazing students. We have encouraged all students to go to confirmation before EASTER!

On Thursday night I had the opportunity to attend mass at the Lazarus Shrine for Healing in Wakefield. This was called an evening with the Queen of Peace and included Ivan Dragicevic, one of the visionaries from Medjugorje. Ivan's mission focuses on youth and families. HIs apparition included the following message: families are being attacked from all sides; renew your family prayer; open yourselves for love; open your hearts; let peace reign and if you are strong, the church will be strong. They were expecting 350 and more than 500 were there in fervent prayer! I participated in the amazing Lenten Journey held at Our Lady of Hope and one night a man who is an RCIA candidate described the love he feels in his heart from going through RCIA. That is what we receive and what we give to our children with this great gift of faith - true love!

MAIN IDEAS

- There is a common misconception that following Jesus is not fun. Underlying this misconception is the fear of being excluded from friend groups or activities due to our beliefs.
- However, being Christian means belonging to a larger community that is relevant, accepting, and fun and has eternal benefits.
- Committing to following Jesus is not always easy and may include times of isolation or persecution. Yet, Jesus designs us to desire goodness that leads to lasting happiness.

- What are some ways we can commit as a family to be closer to Jesus?

SVDP News:

In the tradition of its founder, <u>Blessed</u> <u>Frédéric Ozanam</u>, and patron, <u>St. Vincent de Paul</u>, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a Catholic lay organization inspired by Gospel values. We join to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to neighbors in need. Organized locally, Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity. We make

no distinction in those we serve because, in them, we see the face of Christ.

Our local chapter of the Saint Vincent DePaul Society is a collection of parishioners inspired by Gospel values. We join to grow spiritually by serving those in need and suffering. We meet face-to-face with those seeking assistance, preferably in their home. During these home visits, we bring hope, prayer, and financial resources to neighbors in need through aid with rent, food, utilities, clothing, and other emergency needs.

We live and raise our families in a relatively affluent area. Those we serve are not always visibly indigent but are often hidden in plain sight.

HE MADE HIS DWELLING AMONG US

The Annunciation and the Gospel of Life

The Annunciation celebrates the visit of the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the mother of Jesus. On this great feast day, we not only recall Mary's courageous "ves" to God, we also celebrate the Incarnation of Christ, our Savior. For it was there, in the womb of a woman, nine months before the celebration of the manger, that "the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:14).

The celebration of the Annunciation coincides with the anniversary of the papal encyclical Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life). This prophetic document on the dignity and inviolability of every human life was put forth by Pope John Paul II on the Solemnity of the Annunciation in 1995. The intimate connection of these two events highlights a profound reality about the identity and value of every human person.

Luke's Gospel tells us that by the power of the Holy Spirit, Christ would be conceived within the womb of Mary. It was there, in the womb of the Blessed Mother, that Christ first took on human flesh and made his dwelling among us. Like us, the unborn child Jesus grew and developed beneath the shelter of his mother's loving heart. Through Christ's Incarnation, God chose to share fully and intimately in our humanity and bridge all distance between God and man, so that we may dwell together,



The Church teaches us that "by His incarnation the Son of God has united Himself in some fashion with every man." God desired to dwell among us, as one of us, in order to bring us salvation. This truth "reveals to humanity not only the boundless love of God... but also the incomparable value of every human person."2

Each of us is made in the image and likeness of our Creator, to share in the very life of God himself. This reality "reveals the greatness and the inestimable value of human life." The human person is "a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory."4 Created through the love of the Father, each one of us bears "an indelible imprint of God." By sharing in our humanity, Christ invites us to share in his divinity, that we might dwell with him for eternity.

Therefore, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel."6 Through Christ's descent to earth God desires to raise each one of us to the heights of heaven. May we recognize that to proclaim the Gospel of Life is to proclaim Christ, the one who made his dwelling among us.






