

SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust

Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico,
Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly
remind ourselves that Jesus is the l
secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic
Church and of the entire universe.

Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and —while governments around them crumbled —the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (Quas primas, 7).

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public

life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe.



Edge Class Summary—Grades 6-8 Dear Edge Families,

This Edge Night focused on how the Eucharist changes our souls. We started by discussing the youth mass held last Sunday that included so many young people. Many students came in groups together, so that is something our EDGE students can do also. EDGE began with a game of creating inventions that cause an invisible transformation. A sampling of the inventions that our students came up with are extraordinary: (1) pixie dust added to water that makes you act with kindness; (2) glasses that make you see all good in others; (3) "truth fruit" taking one of these makes you speak with kindness; and a favorite (4) Fecke phone - a megaphone that sounds of trumpets and flute bringing joy (named after longtime Band teacher at HW).

We watched this video by Father Mike "How the Eucharist Changed My Life."

The teaching reminded us that we all need Jesus' saving power to deliver us from sin. We then had to think about responses that would make a selfless vs. selfish response. The selfless examples called on us to help family members, rather than do our own thing. What a reminder to all to think about helping another before doing the self centered act. We were all asked to take an opportunity to give a message of affirmation to someone who needs encouragement. When you receive the Eucharist, ask God to help you see one person in your life as God sees them.

How can we as a family grow in our appreciation of the Eucharist?



Saint Andrew the Apostle

In the synoptic Gospels, Andrew is a Galilean fisherman grouped with his brother, Peter, and with James and John in the inner circle of Apostesis in John's Gospel, he is the disciple of John the Baptist who is the first to follow Jesus and who brings his brother to the Lord. Many traditions about Andrew come from the apocryphal second-century Acts of Andrew, which depicts him as a sealous missionary in the Black Sea region who is crucified—tied to an x-shaped cross—by the Roman governor. Some early church historians also said he evangelized in Greece and Asia Minor. He is the patron saint of Scotland, Russia, Greece, and those who fish for a living.

66 "He was truly a man of faith and hope; and one day he heard John the Bapitst proclaiming Jesus as: "the Lamb of God." (In 1:36); so he was stirred, and with another unnamed disciple followed Jesus, the one whem John had called "the Lamb of God." The Evangelist says that "they saw where he was staying; and they stayed with him that day..." (In 1: 37-39). Thus, Andrew enjoyed precious moments of intimacy with Jesus.


