

EDGE SUMMARY (Grades 6-8)

Dear Edge Families,
At last week's Edge Night, we had the opportunity to learn about the Mass and the ministry of priests. We had an incredible start with a review of Pastor Brogan's Installation Mass and the oaths that he took for us. During the Mass he took an oath to help us all get to heaven - that is a super power! We then went on a search through the church for images of Mary - our Blessed Mother. One lesson we learn from this is seeing. Blessed Mother. One lesson we learn from this is seeing Mary in so many of the stations of the cross. She always has her eyes fixed on Jesus and calls all of us to do the same. A teaching on the Mass followed, and we learned about the four parts of the Mass (the Introductory Rite; the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of the Eucharist and the Concluding Rite - where the priest blesses us and sends us out to be the light of the world). The Edge Night concluded with a moment to world). The Edge Night concluded with a moment to show gratitude to priests by writing thank you cards to Father Lawlor and Father Kiley for their ministry and praying for them. They all wrote cards to Father Brogan the week before. These notes are so beautiful and should inspire all of us to write a note of gratitude to our priests. The Weekly Challenge is to bring a journal to Mass and write a sentence or two from the homily they want to remember.

MAIN IDEAS

- The Eucharist is available to us at Mass through the ministry of priests.
- At the Last Supper, Jesus commanded His apostles to continue to eat His Body and drink His Blood as an eternal reminder.
- · When we better understand the Mass, we can move from silent spectators to full participants.

FAMILY REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- · Which part of the Mass is the most interesting to
- · How can you make efforts to participate more fully when you are at Mass?
- · How can we, as a family, support the ministry of priests?

This past weekend I attended the Boston Marian Conference in Quincy. My first time was last year and that resulted in a trip to Medjugorje ten days later. The conference was nearly double the size of last year with attendees from twenty five states, Ireland and Canada. Bishop Marc O'Connell presided at the Saturday vigil mass and delivered a very powerful homily with the image of Mary taking care of Jesus as a baby and her love for him always. The weekend included daily rosary, three masses, two times of adoration, a presenter who taught us how to meditate on the Sorrowful mysteries of Mary and many talks by on the Sorrowful mysteries of Mary and many talks by speakers who experienced miracles, fought with the devil and resurrected their faith. Many priests attended so that with each Mass there were at least five on the altar and confessions continuously. If you have not been to a retreat please be encouraged to try one. We have Cursillo and other great opportunities for you to find your joy and change your life. They are not easy this weekend was exhausting - but it gives strength to help us all be evangelists. We are all called to be saints so please start on November 1st with Mass for All Saints Day!

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

"You go into the vineyard too." (Mathew 20: 3-4)

Matthew's gospel parable describing the Kingdom of Heaven as being like a householder who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard sets before our eyes the Lord's vast vineyard and the multitude of persons, both women and men, who are called and sent forth by him to labor in it. The vineyard is the whole world (cf. Mt 13:38), which is to be transformed according to the plan of God in view of the final coming of the Kingdom of God.

Please consider joining us in our work in the vineyard. We meet once a month in the OLH parish hall, the first Monday evening of each month, where we pray and review the past month's efforts. Two Vincentians volunteer to be "on-call" each month. One can put as much or as little into their participation as their schedules permit. True faith in Jesus Christ always produces good works.
