All are welcome to this Mass which will be followed by a reception in the lower hall of St. Paul's.

NEWLY RESTORED BAPTISMAL FONT

You will all be pleased to notice the newly



restored baptismal font that now sits to the right of the sanctuary within Our Lady of Hope church. The two photos below are just a representation of the beauty of this font. It originally resided at St. John's Church, Swampscott and was ac-

quired many years ago by Our Lady's. It had been in storage for many years until I decided to have it reconfigured for our purposes. I had the red marble base separated from the font. The statue of St. Therese now sits atop this base. The green marble base was constructed out of remnants from the marble ambo that I had removed from the left side of the sanctuary and the entirety of the font had to be recarved and a drainage system installed for cleaning purposes. This font had a long life of service in Swampscott and has now

been resurrected to continue its original purpose of facilitating the baptisms of children and adults into the Life, Death and Resurrection of Christ. Our "new" baptismal font is just one more project completed within our parishes for the glory of God.
