

The seniors at the Catholic high school were required to do a certain number of community service hours. One project the fall sports teams had to do was to staff the soup kitchen on New Year's Day. Amid many objections about the early hour after being up so late and that it was still a school holiday, students still showed up and worked hard to prepare a cooked meal for several hundred people.

Waiting nervously, the students expected the stereotypical homeless man to show up. The seniors were shocked and even moved to tears when young families, well dressed senior citizens and even kids their own age showed up for dinner. They soon realized that poverty and hunger affect many people. Even more

- On the next page, you may choose YES or NO depending on whether you want to associate your name with an additional school or parish
- Answer the four Yes/No questions on the next page and click "Continue"
- When asked "Have you already attended a VIRTUS Protecting God's Children Session?" answer NO.
- On the next page, choose date and church to attend Protecting God's Children for Adults"

2023-2024 CORI PROCESS

For those who volunteer at Our Lady of Hope and Saint Paul the 2024 CORI forms are available on the rectory porch, exit tables in church and in the sacristy for you to take home and complete. Once completed, we need to verify your ID (driver's license or passport) in person. Not to overload Fr. Brogan at Mass, please stop by parish office to have Joanne DiNatale or Lucy Cronan to verify your picture ID.

Volunteers include anyone who help in service of their time and talent at Our Lady of Hope and Saint Paul.

Volunteers are required to complete a CORI form EACH fiscal year. In addition, you must have completed the Protecting God's Children (PGC) Program and Archdiocesan Code of Conduct. If you are interested in volunteering, and have not volunteered during this past year; please call the rectory to receive a blue form and read the notice to register for the PGC training.

Thank you in advance for your help in this requirement and for all you do in helping us to be a vibrant parish.

Thinking of becoming Catholic? Already Catholic, but never confirmed?

Many Catholics rediscover or reconnect with their faith as adults, and many people decide to convert to Catholicism from another faith, or from no faith background at all. If you (or someone you know) are a Catholic who was Baptized and



received First Communion, but was never confirmed and would like to be, this year, Adult Confirmations will be held in local parishes, and ours at Our Lady of Hope and St. Paul's are on the weekend of October 21st & 22nd. Preparation for adult Confirmation will consist of four weekly gatherings, time & day to be determined by what works best for those who participate.

For anyone who has not received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Communion, and

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults

Confirmation), and who would like to become Catholic, the program called the O.C.I.A. (formerly the R.C.I.A), or Order of Christian

Initiation for Adults, will run from the fall through Pentecost, and those people will be received into the church at the Easter Vigil. Again, the specific time will be discussed among volunteers and participants, but the OCIA does meet on Sundays after a parish Mass.

It is such a gift to grow in faith and relationship with Jesus and the community of the church over the course of our life, and that opportunity is always before us. 
