

# Thinking of becoming Catholic? Already Catholic, but never confirmed?

Many Catholics rediscover or reconnect with their faith as adults, and many people decide to convert to Catholicism from another faith, or from no faith background at all.



If you (or someone you know) are a Catholic who was Baptized and received First Communion, but

was never confirmed and would like to be, this year, Adult Confirmations will be held in local parishes, and ours at Our Lady of Hope and St. Paul's are on the weekend of October 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup>. Preparation for adult Confirmation will consist of four weekly gatherings, time & day to be determined by what works best

for those who participate. For anyone who has not received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation),

and who would like to become Catholic, the program called the O.C.I.A. (formerly the R.C.I.A), or Order of Christian Initiation for Adults, will run from the fall through

Pentecost, and those people will be received into the church at the Easter Vigil. Again, the specific time will be discussed among volunteers and participants, but the OCIA does meet on Sundays after a parish Mass.

Letter to EDGE (Grades 6-8) Parent s from Debra Brown, EDGE Director

Dear EDGE Families,

We hope that you are enjoying the last weeks of summer. This will be the last email to the

full EDGE group. Starting next week, I will be sending more direct emails to those who have registered and/or to those who have not yet registered. St. Paul's EDGE program has been very successful helping middle school students get engaged in their faith with each other as role models. Each year we have leaders from eighth grade, seventh grade and six grade step us to lead groups and teams in our games, in our readings and in discussion. Some highlights of our program are (1) search for Mary in the Church (how many images can each group find); (2) annual tour of the Church and their chance to experience being an altar server; (3) adoration (although we do not use the Eucharist, students experience the entrance of the monstrous); (4) Fat Tuesday pancake dinner for the parish; (5) annual Saint Paul Easter Egg hunt (all eggs filled by Edge students) and many other special nights. This year will bring the special gift of students being able to meet and discuss their faith with Father Brogan! For years we have heard from parents that their students want to come to EDGE - and last year there were EDGE chats where students all encouraged each other to attend. The success of the program starts with families submitting their registrations and some stepping up to help as a CORE Team member. All you need to do is attend - we give you the class summary each night. Most CORE team members get so much out of EDGE for their own faith! So please submit your registration and pick your requested night: Tuesday or Wednesday. If we do not have enough registered it will be made into one night only. We will start at the end of September.

Our new mass schedule - Sunday at 7:30 am (no music) and 9:30 am (beautiful music) has been wonderful. Last Sunday our new music director John Mayer invited everyone to consider joining the newly formed choir that will start in a few weeks. Singing at mass is an amazing experience! #### New to Saint Paul's...

In May 2022 Saint Paul's celebrated its 100th year. There are two entrances to Saint Paul's: one on Union Street and one on Rust Street. We have handicap access at the Rust Street entrance (rear of front entrance) and there is an elevator. Our church was renovated in 1998 and changed from the traditional to the "modern" in the round to remind all of us that - we are the Church and the altar is our center. [We do not have a parking lot but there are some handicap parking spaces behind the rectory at the rear of the church.]

The baptismal font was moved to the center of the front entrance to remind each one of their baptism when they enter Saint Paul's. Over the altar is a "baldacchino" or canopy that symbolizes the place where the bridegroom (Jesus) meets the bride (the Church) and pledges his everlasting love. Our baldacchino was designed as a replica of one in a church in Rome.

The first two stained glass windows on either side of the larger part of the church are of Saint Paul (patron saint of Saint Paul's) and Saint Patrick (patron saint of the Archdiocese of Boston). The stained glass windows in the rear section include spiritual messages that are only revealed when the light hits the windows just right. The confessional is on the Rust Street side.

The only way to the restrooms is through the stairs located on the Rust Street side of the church leading down to the Church Hall. We also have a small chapel on the right side of the Rust Street side of the church. The design of the church is most challenging for our priests (celebrants), lectors and musicians who have to look all different ways. We hope that you will find this information for your first visit or your regular visits and please understand that we are all better together.

We're now just about 3 1/2 years into the "New Normal" under the COVID-19 pandemic and thankfully the financial condition of our Parish is staying on course. First, we received all of the money pledged to the Capital Campaign "*Renew My Church*" where we met our goal of raising \$350,000 to cover the upgrades to the Church – Thank you all very much!

Operationally, total revenues for the year were up about \$177,000 mainly from the Grand Annual collection, \$97,000, which we didn't ask for last year in light of the Capital Campaign, and from Gifts, Bequests, and other revenue in the amount of \$80,000 over last year. The Offertory collections, religious education and the fuel collection in total were all within \$1,200 of what we collected last year.

Operating expenses were up from last year by about \$60,000; \$35,000 for salaries, wages, and benefits, and \$25,000 for Church and Rectory operating expenses. 


