The Criteria:

The person should be a worker, a man or woman for others, who through his or her actions in the workplace demonstrates the Christian values of faith, service, personal integrity, respect, spirituality, humility and care for the whole person. The Christian worker should show his/her love for God through his/her love for "neighbors". This would include concern for the disadvantaged and marginalized and respect for all, in and out of the workplace.

Using work to provide a livelihood for their families and themselves, Christian worker should act in such a way as to also benefit the larger society. They should use personal labor, talent and energy for the greater good of all.

The candidate should also embody the values of Saint Joseph who was a just, honest and courageous man but also a person of action. Through his resolute actions, he demonstrated his faith, love and acceptance of God's will under challenging and even dangerous circumstances. Joseph took on immense responsibility humbly and without hesitation.

The nominee should be an active Catholic engaged in either the private or public sectors – working in either labor or management positions.
