The Nineteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time, Sunday, August 13, 2023

This Sunday's Readings

FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19: 9a, 11-13a The Lord appears to Elijah in a whisper. RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 85: 9-14

The Lord is the source of salvation.

SECOND READING: Romans 9:1-5; Paul speaks of the

blessings that have come to the Israelites.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 14: 22-33

Jesus walks on water, and the disciples acknowledge

him as the Son of God.

BACKGROUND ON THE GOSPEL READING: For the sake of the crowds that follow Him, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and then withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in Chapter of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus calms the seas. This time, however, Jesus does not calm the seas, and the disciples do not express fear until they see Jesus walking toward them on the water. In this story it is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for a ghost.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. Today's Gospel is also about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do. This Gospel tell us much about ministry.

Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. He is not a ghost. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him, however, once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches out to Peter and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, Matthew reports that the wind ceases, and the disciples confess that Jesus is the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. Peter walks on water. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah, God's only Son.



Supporting our Unhoused Parishioners..... Immaculate Conception Parish has multiple ministries (formal and informal) that support the homeless or unhoused members of our downtown community. In addition to Bread & Blessing, and St. Benedict Labre Ministries, we also have an active St. Vincent de Paul group, and the Parish Office staff daily feeds a number of unhoused individuals. Lately, there appears to be a growing number of people panhandling (coming up to you in the parking lot or to your car asking you for money). While it might seem a charitable thing to do, it can also be a way of enabling inappropriate behavior, and for those who use the money they collect for alcohol or others drugs is actually contributing to their ill health. The best thing to do is to let the person know that you cannot give them money. On Sundays, please just direct them to the Basement Parish Hall where they can receive a satisfying lunch at no charge. 


We are using LTP's At Home with the Word, 2023. Copies of the book are available in the Parish Office for \$15 each.

Catholic Charities helps people find their peaceful dwelling place, with programs to rehouse the homel ess, prevent eviction, providing long-term housing for those with mental/physical disabilities, and building affordable housing communities across New Mexico. Learn more at www.CCASFNM.org

Our programs go beyond 4 walls of a home. We walk alongside those we help, by providing case management to guide them on their journey to self-sufficiency and stability. Thanks to donations from the community, we can set up their home with furniture, home décor, basic living supplies like pots, pans, cleaning tools, and even groceries which make sure their welcome home is truly welcome. We do that thanks to you and the many organizations and churches who help us with their support.

FROM HOMELESS TO HOME: Our programs rely on a self-sufficiency model where participants are assisted to find durable solutions through employment and other supports to transition them to a more stable livelihood. Programs range from one-time emergency rental assistance to long-term permanent housing programs.

Center for Self-Sufficiency and Housing Assistance

PROYECTO LA LUZ: This program is available for families with dependent children experiencing homelessness as a gateway to self- sufficiency. Proyecto La Luz participants receive quality support from Catholic Charities' case managers, who assist them in accessing housing, benefits, counseling, childcare, educational, and employment opportunities.

PARTNERS IN HOUSING: Serves individuals and single parents and their children, who have a disability or who have been chronically homeless in Bernalillo County (12 months or longer).

The focus of participants in this program is to build a stable home for themselves and their children, while they obtain the appropriate services that will lead to their increased well-being. Participants receive assistance from case managers in obtaining housing, disability benefits, counseling, child care, and other resources.

PREVENTING HOMELESSNESS: The Rental Assistance Program (RAP) helps serve individuals and families in Bernalillo and Sandoval counties. We are often overwhelmed by the need and request that you go to www.ccasfnm.org/cssha to complete a questionnaire.

CURRENTLY HOMELESS? If you are experiencing homelessness, the first step is to complete a housing assessment through the NM Coalition to End Homelessness. This is shared among multiple agencies.

WITH YOU ON THE JOURNEY: In addition to financial assistance, case management, and life skills education are offered to those that we assist through any of our rehousing, housing or homelessness prevention programs to help people find on their journey to long-term stability.

Rehoused individuals will also receive furnishings, decor, and cleaning and other supplies which help create a warm, inviting home and give people the tools needed to maintain their housing as they rebuild their lives.


