

The 28th Sunday In Ordinary Time, Sunday, October 22, 2023

This Sunday's Readings

FIRST READING: Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6; The Lord chooses Cyrus to subdue the nations for the sake of Israel.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 96: 1, 3-10

Sing praise to the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1 -5b; Paul greets the Thessalonians, recalling the Gospel they received.

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 22: 15-21; The Pharisees send their disciples to test Jesus with a question about taxes.

BACKGROUND ON THE GOSPEL READING: In today's Gospel Jesus and the religious leaders in Jerusalem continue their tense exchange of questions and challenges. At this point the disciples of the Pharisees, together with the Herodians, try to entrap Jesus by their question about the payment of taxes.

Matthew sets up an unusual partnership between the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Herodians were supporters of Herod Antipas, a Jewish political leader who collaborated with the Romans. Such collaboration would have required a compromised observance of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees, on the other hand, taught scrupulous observance of the Mosaic Law and opposed Roman occupation. Herodians favored the payment of taxes; the Pharisees opposed it. The Herodians and the Pharisees approach Jesus, asking that he take sides in their dispute. If Jesus answers with the Pharisees, he shows himself to be an enemy of Rome. If he answers with the Herodians, he offends popular Jewish religious sensibilities.

of his questioners. From his first words to them, Jesus shows that he is very much aware of what they are trying to do. He asks to see a Roman coin, which is readily provided to him. It may have come from the hand of a Herodian, but the Pharisees show themselves to be quite willing to accept this compromise. Jesus has already exposed the Pharisees as hypocrites.

Jesus takes his response one step further. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Avoiding the question of lawfulness altogether,

the importance of keeping things in their proper perspective. Do we attach ourselves to worldly things at the expense of the love and honor that we owe to God?

October Apostleship of Prayer Intention: For the Synod We pray for the Church, that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a lifestyle at every level, and allow herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the peripheries of the world.

One of the most important gatherings in the long history of the Catholic Church has begun. The first of two <u>Synods on Synodality</u> convened in Rome on <u>October 4</u>, and consider questions that have the potential to change the course of Catholicism.

The synods, gatherings of bishops from around the world, are the final stage of a <u>process</u> initiated by Pope Francis two years ago. It began from the bottom up, with listening sessions in parishes, and continued through national and continental conferences that synthesized the issues and topics which emerged from voices in the pews.

The goal <u>announced</u> by the Vatican <u>at the start of all</u> <u>this</u>: "To enable the Church to better witness to the Gospel, especially with those who live on the spiritual, social, economic, political, geographical, and existential peripheries of our world."



Immaculate Conception Parish has multiple ministries (formal and informal) that support the homeless or unhoused members of our downtown community.

In addition to Bread & Blessing, and St. Benedict Labre Ministries, we also have an active St. Vincent de Paul group, and the Parish Office staff daily feeds a number of unhoused individuals.

Lately, there appears to be a growing number of people panhandling (coming up to you in the parking lot or to your car asking you for money).

While it might seem a charitable thing to do, it can also be a way of enabling inappropriate behavior, and for those who use the money they collect for alcohol or others drugs is actually contributing to their ill health.

The best thing to do is to let the person know that you cannot give them money. On Sundays, please just direct them to the Basement Parish Hall where they can receive a satisfying lunch at no charge. Other days of the week, please direct them to the Parish Office.

On the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, October 4, St. Mary's School ended the Season of Creation with the Blessing of the Animals.


All pets were lined up with such excitement that barking could be heard all across downtown. It was a procession of animals, everything from dogs and cats to guinea pigs and even snakes.





On Friday, September 8, a magnitude 6.8 earthquake struck Morocco near Marrakech.

The impact of the quake was felt as far north as Casablanca, though its epicenter was in the High Atlas Mountains, where hard-to-reach communities suffered the most severe damage. More than 300,000 people are affected and at least 2,490 were killed. Access to remote areas with the worst destruction remains difficult.

This is the strongest earthquake to hit Morocco in over a century. Hundreds of thousands of people are struggling to contact loved ones and access immediate aid, including safe shelter, clean water, food and medical assistance. As search and rescue efforts continue, mosques throughout Morocco are holding prayers for victims. The enormity of loss and grief is widespread as people navigate the aftermath of the quake—and any potential aftershocks.
