that Joseph and Mary made from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a safe refuge where Mary could give birth to the baby Jesus. When they were unable to find lodging in Bethlehem, Joseph and Mary were forced to seek shelter in a stable, where the Christ Child was born.

The piñata used in Posadas is shaped like a sevenpointed star. Each point represents the seven deadly sins that are broken as soon as María and José are granted a place to stay. The piñata is normally filled with candy, and once it is fully broken, a prayer is said and the festivities begin.

Sunday Connection

The Fourth Sunday of Advent, Cycle B Sunday, December 24, 2023

Today's Readings

<u>FIRST READING</u>: *2 Samuel 7: 1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16* The Lord promises David that he will raise from his descendants a kingdom that will endure forever.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Psalm 89: 2-5,27, 29;* A prayer of praise to the Lord for his faithfulness to his covenant.

SECOND READING: Romans 16: 25-27

Paul praises God for making his revelation known.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 1: 26-38; The angel Gabriel visits

Mary to announce the birth of Jesus.

BACKGROUND ON THE GOSPEL READING: This Sunday we read the story of the angel Gabriel's announcement to Mary about the birth of Jesus. This story is found only in Luke's Gospel. On this fourth Sunday of Advent, the liturgy shifts our attention from John the Baptist to Mary, the mother of Jesus. Both John and Mary serve as important figures for our reflection during the season of Advent; they both played instrumental roles in preparing the way for Jesus. Last week we reflected on John the Baptist's announcement that the Savior was among us, although not yet recognized. This week we reflect upon Mary's example of faith and obedience to God, traits which permitted her to receive the angel's message that God's Son would be born as a human person, as one of us.

We are familiar with the story of the Annunciation, and it is fitting that we recall how God announced the birth of Jesus as we make our final preparations for our celebration of the Incarnation. The angel Gabriel visited Mary, a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph. Mary greeted the angel's news with awe and wonder and asked how it could be possible that she could give birth to a child. In his reply, the angel Gabriel announced the seemingly impossible reality: the child to be born would be conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and would be God's own Son. The angel reported to Mary another miracle; her relative Elizabeth was also pregnant despite having been thought to be unable to have a child. Mary's response to the angel, which is called her *fiat*, is an example of complete faith and obedience to God.

The story of the Annunciation calls to our attention God's

wondrous action in human history. God chose a human person to give birth to his Son so that all humanity would know God's salvation. Mary, already full of God's grace, was able to cooperate in this great plan for our salvation. Thus Jesus was born as one of us, fully human and also fully divine. This is the mystery we prepare to celebrate at Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation. In the model of Mary, we pray that we will be people of faith who recognize God's saving plan for us and are able respond with obedience.

DECEMBER 24, FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT, AND DECEMBER 25, CHRISTMAS DAY, **SCHEDULE**

This year, Christmas falls on a Monday. For this reason, we will have the following schedule:

- On Saturday, December 23: the regular 4pm Mass;
- On Sunday, December 24: the regular Sunday schedule with Masses at 8am, 10am, and 12:30pm (Spanish);
- On Sunday, December 24, an 8pm Christmas Eve Mass.
- On Monday, December 25, we will have a regular Sunday schedule again with Masses at 8am, 10am and 12:30pm (Spanish).

Invariably people want to know if attending Mass on Christmas Eve satisfies the Christmas Day Mass obligation, or if attending Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day satisfies the Sunday Mass obligation. The answer to both of these questions is *NO*, and the reason for this is because the focus or the theme of the Masses, as well as all of the prayers and readings are very different.

FOR DECEMBER 31, THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY, the regular Saturday Evening/Sunday Schedule applies.

For January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy MOTHER OF GOD, there will be only one Mass, at 12:10pm. January 1 is a Holy Day of Obligation in the United States *unless it falls on a Monday*. This is so that attention is not taken away from the Sunday Mass, which is always the primary Mass of the week.

FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTIONS ~~ Our next Devotions will be on Friday, January 5, 2024.

On the 1st Friday of each month, we celebrate the 7am Mass, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Adoration from 7:30 until 11:45am Benediction. The regularly scheduled 12:10pm Mass follows.

Confessions are as scheduled from 11am to 12noon.

SUPPORTING OUR UNHOUSED PARISHIONERS.....

Immaculate Conception Parish has multiple ministries that support the homeless or unhoused members of our downtown community. In addition to Bread & Blessing, and *St. Benedict Labre Ministries*, we also have an active *St. Vincent de Paul* group, and the Parish Office staff daily feeds a number of unhoused individuals.

Lately, there appears to be a growing number of people panhandling (coming up to you in the parking lot or to your car asking you for money). While it might seem a charitable thing to do, it can also be a way of enabling inappropriate behavior, and for those who use the money they collect for alcohol or others drugs is actually contributing to their ill health.

The best thing to do is to let the person know that you cannot give them money. On Sundays, please just direct them to the Basement Parish Hall where they can receive a satisfying lunch at no charge. Other days of the week, please direct them to the Parish Office.
