First Reading: *Exodus 19:2-6a*

God tells Moses that the Israelites will be his special people.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 100:1-3,5*

We are the people of God.

Second Reading: *Romans 5:6-11*

Christ died for us while we were still sinners and reconciled us to God.

Gospel Reading: *Matthew 9:36-10:8*

Jesus sends the twelve apostles to proclaim the kingdom of heaven.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions twelve disciples. Many scholars believe that the twelve disciples symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and the Church.

Matthew lists the names of the twelve disciples, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word *apostle* when referring to the Twelve. The word *apostle* means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of

Space is limited and filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

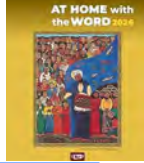

Pious Exercises

Pious exercises are ways that many Christians express their faith either in public or in private. They are not part of the official liturgy of the Church, but they harmonize with it. When prayed well, popular devotions stimulate people's faith and help them worship God even better in the liturgy. These devotions cover a broad range of interests—the Sacred Heart, the Immaculate Conception, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and the Rosary, to name but a few. They become "popular" as they spread among people who find them helpful to develop their piety as individuals or in groups. Many pious exercises are shared by a large number of people, and their practice has been passed on from one generation to the next. These developments show the value of such devotions. Prior to the Second Vatican Council, pious exercises profoundly formed the spiritual lives of Catholics partly because they could be prayed in vernacular languages. Although Catholics prayed at Mass when it was always in Latin, they have participated more fully, consciously, and actively ever since the Mass has become available to them in their own tongue.

The liturgical renewal appropriately drew Catholics more deeply into the liturgy, which is the most important form of common prayer. Some pious exercises have become less available and less practiced because devotion to the Mass has increased. However, Catholics are still encouraged to develop pious exercises to balance a healthy spiritual life. The Vatican has dealt with this matter in its Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy: Principles and Guidelines. It indicates that these devotions are at their best when they lead people back to the Mass and other forms of liturgical prayer.
