

First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

A descendent of Jesse will usher in a time of peace.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 72:1-2,7-8,12-13,17 The Messiah will bring justice and peace to the nations.

Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9

Both Jews and Gentiles glorify God for the salvation found in Christ Iesus.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 3:1-12 John the Baptist appears in Judea preaching a message of repentance.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In this week's Gospel Reading and next week's, our Advent preparation for Christmas invites us to consider John the Baptist and his relationship to Iesus. In this week's Gospel, Matthew describes the work and preaching of John the Baptist.

John the Baptist appears in the tradition of the great prophets of Israel, preaching repentance and reform to the people of Israel. In fact, the description of John found in this reading is reminiscent of the description of the prophet Elijah (2 Kings 1:8). In this reading, John directs a particularly pointed call to repentance to the Pharisees and Sadducees, parties within the Jewish community of the first century.

Iohn marks the conversion of those who seek him out with a baptism of repentance. Other groups in this period are thought to have practiced ritual washings for similar purposes, and John's baptism may have been related to the practices of the Essenes, a Jewish sect of the first century. John's baptism can be understood as an anticipation of Christian baptism. In this passage, John himself alludes to the difference between his baptism and the one yet to come: "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance . . . He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." (Matthew 3:11).

and the Making of America, by John J. Fialka. If you wish to join us, this book is available on Amazon and through other booksellers and libraries.



Organ Announcement

A Hearty Thanks to those who supported ACA and our Organ Replacement Project this year Many thanks to those people who contributed so generously to

the installation of the newly acquired organ console. The console is installed and is in working condition, so we should soon be hearing wonderful music coming once again from the choir loft! There is still work to be done on the entire system (adjustment to pipes, replacement of some of the leather components like the bellows, reservoirs, and



pouches, which are crucial for regulating airflow to the pipes) but these will be taking place over the next 12 months as money becomes available.

Since our ACA campaign was very successful this year, again thanks to those who participated in ACA, we will receive approximately \$10,000 BACK from the Archdiocese, which our Finance Council has approved to do some additional work on the organ. Those of you who have made a 2025 Pledge to the ACA are asked to fulfill those pledges before the end of the year. If you have not pledged to the ACA but would like to contribute to this, please go to https://

In this reading, John makes very clear that his relationship to the Messiah yet to come (Jesus) is one of service and subservience: "... the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals" (Matthew 3:11). In the context of Matthew's Gospel, today's passage is followed by Jesus' baptism by John, an event that is attested to in all four of the Gospels and appears to have been the start of Jesus' public ministry.

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus in the first century, we, too, are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by our repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives, as John did, the coming of the Lord.

Do Re Mi and St. John the Baptist

John the Baptist is ultimately responsible for the names of the notes in the musical scale. In the eighth century, an unknown poet and composer wrote a hymn in Latin to observe the celebration of the birth of John the Baptist (June 24).

Here are the words of the first verse:

Ut queant laxis / resonare fibris / Mira gestorum/ famuli tuorum, / Solve polluti / labii reatum, /Sancte Ioannes.

This verse asks St. John the Baptist to loosen our voices to praise God, just as the voice of his father Zechariah was loosened. Zechariah had been mute throughout Elizabeth's pregnancy, and got his voice back after John was born. In the eleventh century, musician Guido of Arezzo noticed something about the melody of that hymn. The first note of each phrase begins one pitch higher than the preceding one, spelling out the first six notes of the scale. As you can see, the Latin syllables associated with them are ut-re-mi-fa-sol-la. Guido gave the pitches those names, based on the hymn to John the Baptist. The first letters of the final two words (Sancte Ioannes) eventually gave the name to the seventh pitch, originally called "si". It was later altered to "ti"—just as "ut" was changed to "do"—probably because it was more pleasing to the ear. The hymn is still part of the official Evening Prayer of the Roman Catholic Church. Near the longest day of the year, when the sun starts its descent, the notes mark their ascent. John the Baptist said of Jesus, "He must increase; but I must decrease" (John 3:30). As the decreasing light of day recalls the birth of John the Baptist, the ascending notes of the scale, point the way toward Jesus Christ.
