Next Sunday's Readings

First Reading: Sirach 3:17-18,20,28-29

Humble yourself and you will find favor with God

Gospel Reading; Luke 14:1,7-14
When you hold a banquet invite

When you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Meals played an important role in the society in which Jesus lived. More than a time for sharing nourishment, they were a time to share ideas and to model different aspects of social relationships. In Luke's Gospel, the places that a person ate (at the home of a tax collector, 5:29), the people with whom a person ate (sinners, 5:30), whether a person washed before eating (11:38), and, as is the case here, the place that a person sits while eating are all important. The narrator says Jesus tells a parable, but it is really wise advice to both guests and hosts about finding true happiness at the heavenly banquet.

Jesus warns guests to wait before taking their places at the table lest they be asked to move if someone more important arrives. This is more than just a lesson about dinner etiquette. It is advice on how to find your true place in the Kingdom of God. Jesus advises hosts not to invite people who would be expected to repay them to dinner but to invite those who could not repay: the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. This is where real blessings can be found.

In these sayings, Luke gives us not only advice on how to approach the end times but also on how to live according to Jesus' vision of a good society. Luke's Gospel also advises us how the Church must be part of bringing about this society. It is yet another example in Luke's Gospel of the reversal the kingdom brings about.





Homily Feedback

You critique your homilist all the time. Talking with other parishioners, around the family table, at work, and in your mind repeatedly you've formed a lot of opinions about what your preacher says. But have you ever told a homilist what you think? Most preachers get very little feedback from the assembly. But preachers have ways of finding out what people think. Does the parent of a crying child make any effort to calm the baby? Are people reading the bulletin instead of listening to the talk? Do jokes fall flat? Are some people poised to stand up as soon as the homily ends, like sprinters waiting for the whistle? Preachers have a general idea how attentive the listeners are. But most preachers don't get systematic feedback. And homilists rarely get to hear one another. You may try out several different preachers in the course of a year, but homilists don't. They work on Sundays. If you've got something to say to your homilist, you'd do the whole parish a favor by speaking up. You should say positive things as well as negative ones. And never do it anonymously. Say it in person, on the phone, or write it and sign your name. You'll learn tact and you'll accept responsibility for what you say. Your preacher may want to talk with you about your ideas. Here are some points to consider when you give feedback:

- Communication: Do you get the point of the talk?
- Organization: Does the homily have a beginning, a middle, and an end?
- Scripture: Does the homily help you understand and apply the Scripture?
- Significance: Does the homily touch your life?
- Appearance: Do your preacher's appearance or habits distract you from the message?
- Sincerity: Does your preacher seem to believe the mes-
- Audio: Do the sound system and acoustics help you hear?
- Improvement: Is your preacher better now than a year

Only you can change your opinions from idle gossip to helpful dialogue.

My dear brother priests,

As we are all aware, the situation in Gaza has reached a crisis point as people there are suffering from bombings, constant relocation, lack of medical support, and starvation. Given these facts, I ask that you take up a special collection for our brothers and sisters in Gaza who are in such great need. Please announce this collection for the next three Sundays, August 17, 24 and 31. Then, I ask that you send the money collected for this critical cause as soon as possible to Julie Anne Sanchez at the Pastoral Center. This collection is being urged by our own concern for those in Gaza and by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

The donations will be sent by the archdiocese directly to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) and to Catholic Relief Services (CRS). Eash will receive half of what is donated. CNEWA is providing vital emergency humanitarian relief and medical and psychological care for the sick, malnourished and wounded in Gaza. CRS is working through local Church partners to provide food, shelter, cash assistance, hygiene supplies and care for people's emotional well-being. Please explain to our parishioners that their donations will be sent by the archdiocese directly to these two Catholic agencies, thus assuring that the aid will get to those in need in Gaza.

Please continue to remember those in Gaza in the Prayers of the Faithful at all weekend and daily Masses. Thank you very much for your immediate response as our local Church here in the southwest does what it can to assist our brothers and sisters in Gaza.
