Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 21, 2025 Next Sunday's Readings

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

Unfair business practices and injustice to the poor will be judged by God.

Responsorial Psalm; *Psalm 113: 1-2,4-6,7-8* Praise be to God, who raises up the poor.

Second Reading; 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Paul tells Timothy that prayer for those in authority is pleasing to God because God wills the salvation of all.

Gospel Reading; *Luke 16:1-13* (shorter form, Luke 16:10-13)

Jesus tells a parable about a dishonest steward who is commended for his prudence; one cannot serve both God and money.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel sounds puzzling to contemporary readers, but it can be made less so by considering the economic system which stands behind the parable. A steward is dismissed because he is squandering his master's property. He is called dishonest because he is not serving the interests of the rich man, his employer. In response the steward, in an attempt to ensure favor for himself among the rich man's debtors, brokers repayment of the rich man's loans by foregoing the interest and fees that had been levied to line the steward's pockets. It is this action, in which the steward puts aside his greed and takes the longer perspective in order to enhance his security, which is commended by the rich man.

The passage concludes with three morals for the listeners. The first exhorts the listener to be prudent about the use of wealth. Like the steward in the parable, those who would follow Jesus must put transitory affairs in proper perspective. Christians should handle the affairs of temporal life with an eye toward eternal life.

The second concerns trustworthiness. Those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. If Christians handle money and other passing things responsibly, then they can also be trusted with the affairs of the Kingdom of God.

Finally, Jesus tells his listeners that no one can serve two masters simultaneously. God must be put ahead of money.

Evangelist Symbols

The human, lion, ox, and eagle are symbols of the four evangelists: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

These symbols adorn many works of art, buildings, and objects used in worship. Each may identify one evangelist, or the four may represent the Gospel as a whole. In addition, the four symbols taken together represent the mystery of Christ's life. They recall in turn the birth, sacrifice, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus.

The symbols derive from the opening of the Book of Ezekiel. There the prophet envisions four living creatures in the middle of a glowing fire from a stormy north wind. The faces of the creatures resemble a human being, a lion, an ox, and an eagle (1:10). Their mystery and their movement made such an impact on the prophet that Christian generations have seen in their appearance a foreshadowing of the Gospels of Jesus Christ.

The figures appear again in Revelation 4:7. The human being—sometimes rendered as an angel—signifies Matthew, who opens his story with the human origins of Jesus' genealogy. The lion, according to legend, sleeps with eyes open, making it a symbol of resurrection. It depicts Mark, whose Gospel begins with the leonine John the Baptist in the desert. Luke's account of the infancy of Jesus places the child in the temple with Zechariah, a priest who offered sacrifice of animals including oxen. The horns of the beast may represent the old and new covenant, each with its own sacrifice. John, the evangelist whose work intently gazes on the eternal Word who shattered the darkness with his light, recalls the eagle that flies face into the sun. In this way, tradition has assigned each evangelist a proper symbol.

Organ Fund




Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we have reached and exceeded our initial goal for the installation of the pipe organ. As of Thursday, September 11, we have raised 43,695.00! Thank you to all of our donors.

The work on the installation is moving along but slowly and, unfortunately, will cost us more than the originally forecast amount of \$40,000. We do not have an exact total for the entire job of retrofitting the organ console into our choir loft, though we hope that it will not be a lot more than our original forecast

Work progresses slowly since there are no pipe organ installers in Albuquerque, and we are working with a company that comes into the Albuquerque only a handful of times each year.
