**First Reading:** *Amos 6:1,4-7*

God will judge the complacency of the people and their leaders.

**Responsorial Psalm:** *Psalm 146:7-10*

Happy are those who find solace in God, the help of the poor.

**Second Reading:** *1 Timothy 6:11-16*

Paul exhorts Timothy to stay faithful to God in all things.

**Gospel Reading:** *Luke 16:19-31*

Jesus tells the parable of the reversal of fortunes between the rich man and the poor man, Lazarus.

**Background on the Gospel Reading**

A major theme in the Gospel of Luke is the importance of the care of the poor in the life of discipleship. In the parable found in today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the life of a rich man and the poor man, Lazarus, who lives in the shadow of the rich man and his wealth. Both die. Lazarus finds himself in heaven; the rich man in the netherworld. The rich man asks for assistance from Lazarus in his torment. But Abraham reminds the rich man of the good things he had in his life and describes the current situation as a reversal of fortunes. The rich man then asks that Lazarus be sent to warn his family, but this is denied with the reminder that Moses and the prophets have warned of judgment for those who neglect the care of the poor.

In the context of Luke's Gospel, this parable, delivered in the presence of a crowd of listeners, is part of Jesus' response to some Pharisees. These Pharisees are described in Luke's Gospel as "loving money." (Note: The Pharisees were followers of a sect of Judaism active before, during, and after Jesus' lifetime. They taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for popular Jewish piety. They put less emphasis on Temple worship and more on applying the law to everyday life. Though they are often portrayed negatively in the Gospels, they shared many of Jesus' and the early Church's concerns about the law.) Jesus observed that the actions of some Pharisees betrayed misplaced priorities: they spoke one way, but acted in another. The story of the rich man and Lazarus demonstrates the importance of the care of the poor and is a reminder to those who would follow Jesus of the unimportance of wealth in the eyes of God.

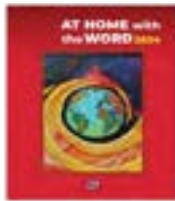

### Blessing Religious Articles

Many Catholics like to use religious articles. Medals, crucifixes, statues, pictures, scapulars, rosaries, and other items made from common elements may be set aside for religious use. They are usually obtained from dealers of church goods, but they may also be fashioned at home by hand. Some religious articles are hung on the wall at home, at school or at work. Others are worn beneath or on top of clothing. It is customary for a deacon or a priest to bless such articles. Religious articles can be a means of evangelization. They depict a symbol of the faith that Catholics hold. They prompt discussion about biblical figures and events, as well as the holy people who have kept the faith throughout history. Many Catholics carry religious articles with them as a reminder of God's presence or to seek divine protection. A blessing sets the articles apart for this sacred purpose. The blessing of religious articles may take place during liturgical prayer. People bring articles with them to church, where the celebrant introduces the service. A Scripture reading is proclaimed. For example, in Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, he says, "All of us, gazing with unveiled face on the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, as from the Lord who is the Spirit" (see 3:17b-4:2). Intercessions are made, and the celebrant concludes with a blessing over the objects and the people. Alternatively, the priest or deacon may say a very short formula apart from a liturgical service: "May this (name of article) and the one who uses it be blessed, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Book of Blessings, 1462). 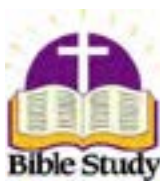

### Organ Fund



Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we have reached and exceeded our initial goal for the installation of the pipe organ. As of Thursday, September 11, we have raised 43,695.00! Thank you to all of our donors.

The work on the installation is moving along but slowly and, unfortunately, will cost us more than the originally forecast amount of \$40,000. We do not have an exact total for the entire job of retrofitting the organ console into our choir loft, though we hope that it will not be a lot more than our original forecast

Work progresses slowly since there are no pipe organ installers in Albuquerque, and we are working with a company that comes into the Albuquerque only a handful of times each year.

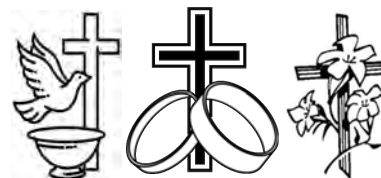
