First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Naaman is cleansed of his leprosy and chooses to serve the God of Israel.

Responsorial Psalm; Psalm 98:1,2-3,3-4 Rejoice! The salvation of God is made known to all.

<u>Second Reading:</u> 2 Timothy 2:8-13 Those who remain faithful to Christ will share Christ's glory.

Gospel Reading: Luke 17:11-19
Jesus heals 10 lepers, and one, the Samaritan, returns to give thanks.

Background on the Gospel Reading


Today we hear about how Jesus, continuing on his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. However, only one is described as glorifying God and returning to thank Jesus. The one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were looked down upon because of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. It is significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.



Organ Fund



Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we have reached and exceeded our initial goal for the installation of the pipe organ; that goal was \$40,000. The work on the installation is moving along but slowly and, unfortunately, will cost us more than the originally forecast amount of \$40,000. We are working with the company responsible for the installation of the organ to get a clearer picture of the anticipated full cost of installation. Work progresses slowly since there are no pipe organ installers in Albuquerque, and we are working with a company that comes into the city only a handful of times each year. Mass for the People

Every Sunday and holyday a pastor celebrates one Mass for the people entrusted to his care (Code of Canon Law, 534). If the pastor cannot do so for a legitimate reason, he may ask another priest to lead it, or he may celebrate the Mass himself on another occasion. If the pastor is responsible for more than one parish on Sundays and holydays, he may celebrate just one Mass for the intentions of all those people. In Latin, this Mass is called the missa pro populo.

Parish bulletins commonly publish the requested intentions for Masses throughout the week. But each weekend one of the Sunday Masses will be designated for this special purpose. It carries a title like "for the people," "for the parish," or "pro populo." The priest and parish receive no offering for this Mass. It is part of the pastor's responsibilities to the parish.

The Mass "for the people" is not required on other days, even though Mass may be well attended. Ash Wednesday and Thanksgiving Day, for example, are not holydays of obligation. Other Mass intentions may be accepted on those days.

This custom reminds the parish community of several values. The pastor has spiritual care for his flock, which includes praying for them and their intentions. The people can see that their priest is responding when they ask him to pray for their concerns. Sundays and holydays are honored as the special days on which the community gathers to praise God, share communion and hold one another in prayer.

At Masses for the people, the pastor is obliged to pray for the parish. Especially at those Masses, it's a good idea for the people to pray for one another as well.
