



Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 19, 2025 Next Sunday's Readings

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Joshua and the Israelites defeat Amalek with the help of God and his servant, Moses.

Responsorial Psalm; Psalm 121:1-2,3-4,5-6,7-8 The Lord is the Guardian of Israel.

<u>Second Reading</u>: 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2 Paul exhorts Timothy to continue to preach the word Timothy received from his teachers.

Gospel Reading: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus urges his disciples to pray and not lose heart, for God hears and answers prayers.

Background on the Gospel Reading

This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer. (The second will be read at Mass next Sunday.) This first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer. (Next Sunday's parable will address attitude in prayer.) While the parable seems to present prayer as nagging God for what we want, such a reading misses the point. God is not like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God can be neither, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers. God truly wants to hear our needs and respond generously. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable. The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.





The work on the installation is moving along but slowly and, unfortunately, will cost us more than the originally forecast amount of \$40,000. We are working with the company responsible for the installation of the organ to get a clearer picture of the anticipated full cost of installation. Work progresses slowly since there are no pipe organ installers in Albuquerque, and we are working with a company that comes into the city only a handful of times each year. Our Organ

Praying the Eucharistic Prayer

The Eucharistic Prayer is the most important part of the Mass. It is also the most demanding part. The Second Vatican Council invited the full, conscious, active participation of the people at Mass. During the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest has almost all the words, but the assembly is not passive. Even here—especially here—in silence and acclamation, we offer full, conscious, active participation.

As the prayer begins, the priest invites us to lift up our hearts. We prepare ourselves to enter into prayer. "[T] he meaning of this Prayer is that the whole congregation of the faithful joins with Christ in confessing the great deeds of God and in the

offering of Sacrifice" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 78). The priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer aloud in the name of the people, but it is essential that all the people pray along. The people, for their part, should associate themselves with the Priest in faith and in silence, as well as by means of their interventions as prescribed in the course of the Eucharistic Prayer: namely the responses in the Preface dialogue, the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy), the acclamation after the Consecration, the acclamatory Amen after the concluding doxology, as well as other acclamations approved by the Conference of Bishops with the *recognitio* of the Holy See (147).

While praying the Eucharistic Prayer, it may help to think of the following: Give thanks for all that God has done. Ask the Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ.

Remember what Jesus said and did at the Last Supper. Offer to God this holy sacrifice. Ask the Holy Spirit to transform everyone. Pray for the needs of the living and the dead.
