

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 26, 2025 <u>Next Sunday's Readings</u>

First Reading: *Sirach 35:12-14,16-18* God hears the prayer of the poor.

Responsorial Psalm; Psalm 34:2-3,17-18,19, 23 The Lord hears and answers the cry of the poor.

Second Reading: *2 Timothy 4:6-8,16-18* Paul perseveres in faith, confident that God will rescue him.

Gospel Reading: Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells the parable of the proud Pharisee who prayed from his self-importance and the tax collector who prayed humbly.

Background on the Gospel Reading

The second parable that Jesus tells in Luke 18 addresses attitude in prayer. In contrasting the prayer of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. Jesus again surprises his listeners by showing the tax collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee. Remember that Pharisees were members of a sect of Judaism active in Jesus' time. They taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for Jewish piety. If anyone would be a model for prayer, a Pharisee was a likely candidate. In contrast, Jesus offers the tax collector as a model for prayer. Tax collectors were collaborators with the Roman authorities in a system that allowed the tax collectors to line their own pockets by charging in excess of the defined taxes. Yet, in this parable, Jesus offers the humility of the tax collector as a model for the prayer of a disciple. The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is too little room for God's grace to work in us.

Persons with Disabilities

The sacraments of the Catholic Church are open to persons with disabilities. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops supports this practice in its Guidelines for the Celebration of the Sacraments with Persons with Disabilities. A disability is never a reason for deferring Baptism. Unbaptized adults or children of catechetical age should receive formation according to their understanding. After their initiation, persons with disabilities may serve as sponsors. Those baptized as infants may be confirmed in the United States between the age of discretion and age eighteen, depending on the diocesan policy. Persons who never attain the use of reason because of mental disabilities may receive Confirmation at the appropriate time. To receive Communion, a person should be able to distinguish it from ordinary food. If ministers are in doubt, their decision should favor the rights of the baptized. A mental disability does not automatically disqualify a person from Holy Com-

The Sacrament of Penance is open to all those who have a sense of sin, even if they do not have full use of reason. Those who are hearing impaired have a right to confess to a priest who knows sign language, or to use an interpreter who must keep the confession secret, or to write their sins for a priest to read. A disability is not necessarily an illness. Those with disabilities may receive the Anointing of the Sick under the same criteria as other Catholics. A physical disability does not necessarily disqualify a person from Holy Orders. However, to be ordained—or to be married—does require the use of reason. Persons who are hearing impaired may be married using sign language or an interpreter.

Some persons with disabilities can be effective in preparing others for marriage and other sacraments.


