Veteran Spotlight-Dave Telvick

Thank you, Dave, for your service! Dave Telvick was born in 1964 and lived in the tiny Wisconsin town of Deansville. He went to Deerfield schools and graduated from Madison LaFollette High School in 1982. As the son of a Marine Corps veteran, and with an urge to serve, Dave decided to enlist in the US Navy three months after graduating. Being unable to travel much growing up, enlisting also satisfied his urge to see the world.

Dave completed his basic training at Great Lakes Naval Base in Illinois with an MOS in aircraft electronics. He completed his electronics training at the Naval Air Station in Memphis TN and his flight school/air crew training at the Naval Air Station in Pensacola FL. Later, he was transferred to Norfolk VA where he completed training for electronics and radar operation and repair, both ground and in-flight, on the E2C Hawkeye aircraft. This surveillance aircraft is similar to the AWACS. The E2C Hawkeye was designed to put fighter aircraft together with air and surface threats. He was stationed aboard the nuclear-powered aircraft carrier USS Carl Vinson, a newly commissioned vessel. He and the crew of 4999 more would spend the majority of their time in the Navy aboard the Carl Vinson.

Dave spent 2 years and 3 months at sea aboard the Carl Vinson. During that time, the ship and crew traveled from Miramar CA to Alaska, Japan, the Indian Ocean, Australia and many other destinations. While on a six-week deployment with two other carrier groups in the Sea of Japan, the Russians sent a force of fighter planes into the operation to harass, which escalated tensions by ignoring the rules of engagement. It was a tense situation as US and Russian planes collided mid-air which nearly caused missiles to fly and further escalate the Cold War. The Squadron CO stated this was "the closest I ever want to get to World War III."

During another deployment and in flight, Dave used his skill as a radar operator to locate a Russian attack submarine that has US had been searching for but unable to find for several weeks. He was recognized by his commanders for this action and required to give every detail and technique that he used to improve training.

Dave was honorably discharged from the Navy in September of 1988 and went to college for a few years after but realized that this was not for him. He and his father founded Remington Electric in Madison WI. They did everything from residential wiring, road construction to street lighting and traffic light installation and repairs. In 2009, he reconnected with Lorna, now his wife, who he first met in 1994. They were married in 2013. After several years of splitting time living working in WI and CA, they decided to move permanently to California in 2014, and continue to do residential work, build garages, build water collection systems and more. Dave and Lorna reside in Santa Barbara CA with their dogs Banner and Madison.

Dave commented that the best people he ever met worked on the flight deck of an aircraft carrier. You were always in harm's way, needed to be alert, and look out for everyone. He stated, "...you could always count on your buddies." He also recommends that young people do something to serve your country. Thank you again, Dave, for your service!
