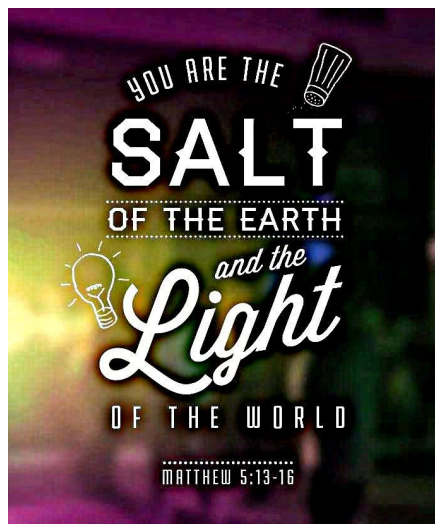
MARRIAGE

CALLED AND CHOSEN

This Sunday's scriptural message carries on the theme of being called and chosen. Only this Sunday, the call becomes much more specific, even though it is couched in metaphorical language. Jesus tells us that God has chosen us to flavor and brighten the lives of those around us. That flavor is the flavor of justice. That light is the light that reveals God in our midst. To be flavor and light means more than giving good example. As salt of the earth, we are called to flavor the earth with the taste of God. As light of the world, we are chosen to participate in the light and life of God, and thus **be** the light that leads others to God. This is no small inheritance and no small responsibility. You see, even though Jesus often spoke in metaphors or parables, he was no puny pundit, no fickle philosopher. Jesus did not come to urge us to live by slogans. Jesus did not come to teach us how to remove ourselves from the world and its passions and cares. Jesus came as a fiery prophet, calling us to jump headfirst into the world and urging us to prepare ourselves and the world for a more just social order. Jesus did not come to preach lackluster love of the status quo. Rather, Jesus came demanding a burning energy of will in order to create all things new. For this we have been called and chosen.

The world's greatest female detectives are attending the annual ladies night dinner at the Mystery Detectives Social Club when a mystery killer is targeting men.

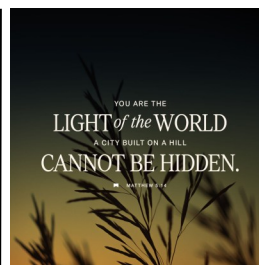
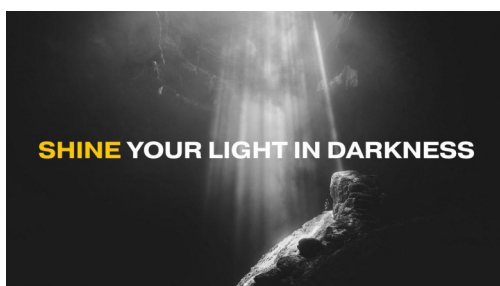
Who will solve the mystery? Jessica Fletcher, Mrs. Matlock, Velma from Scooby Doo, Kelly from Charlie's Angels or you?
