

Classroom activity

Friendship Scavenger Hunt

Year level **3**



Duration	30 minutes
Learning intention	Students identify the qualities of friends in their classroom.
Activity focus	Students complete the scavenger hunt activity by finding qualities of good friends within the classroom.
Resources required	<ul style="list-style-type: none">1 x Scavenger Hunt Template [30 spaces]1 x Scavenger Hunt Template [20 spaces]1 x Scavenger Hunt Template [10 spaces]
Curriculum and wellbeing themes	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Personal and social skillsRelationships
Success criteria	<p>I can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Identify the qualities of a good friendIdentify a good friend within my class
Activity description	<ol style="list-style-type: none">As a class, brainstorm the qualities of a friend. Come up with enough qualities to fill a scavenger hunt grid.Fill in the scavenger hunt grid by adding in a quality of a friend to each box. Examples may include: trustworthy, kind, brave, upstander, helpful, positive, wise.When the teacher says, 'go', students go around the classroom finding a student to match up to each quality. For example, if one of the qualities is, "a good friend is a good listener", students ask, "why are you a good listener?". After they explain why, write that person's name in the box.The first student to fill all boxes with student names, is the winner. (Note: avoid writing the same person's name more than once.)
Differentiation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Supporting the Learner: Identify students who fit each quality as a class.Extending the Learner: Ask individual students to come up with their own scavenger hunt grid.
Reflection question	What did you learn about someone today? Do we all have the qualities that make us friends?
