## Friendship 'Zine'

## Year level 6



Duration	45 minutes
Learning intention	Students learn how to support each other
Activity focus	This activity allows students to explore how to identify a good friend, how to be a good friend and tips on what to do in a tricky situation. The creation of a Friendship Zine gives students the creative freedom to show what they know about being a good friend.
Resources required	Resources to make a zine (digital, 8 grid page, zine template)
Curriculum and wellbeing themes	<ul><li>Social management</li><li>Wellbeing</li></ul>
Success criteria	I can:  Oldentify what it means to be a good friend Oldentify strengths that make me a good friend Oldentify strategies for myself and others
Activity description	<ol> <li>Let students know they are going to be completing an 8 page mini-zine to support each other in being a good friend.</li> <li>Students get creative and design each page of the zine with the following concepts         <ul> <li>Front Cover</li> <li>Definition: a good friend</li> <li>What makes a good friend?</li> <li>What makes me a good friend?</li> <li>Strategies: someone isn't being good to me</li> <li>Strategies: I'm not sure how to help a friend</li> <li>Tips: How to apologise</li> <li>Back Cover</li> </ul> </li> <li>Keep zines on display for students to read during quiet reading time.</li> </ol>
Differentiation	<ul> <li>Supporting the Learmer: Students work in pairs to create an 8 page zine</li> <li>Extending the Learner: Include research and/or evidence within the zine that supports being a positive friend.</li> </ul>
Reflection question	What did you learn from reading someone else's zine?
