Pilgrimage

The Lord said to Moses on Mount Sinai:

"You shall count seven weeks of years – seven times seven years – such that the seven weeks of years amount to forty-nine years. Then, on the tenth day of the seventh month let the ram's horn resound; on this, the Day of Atonement, the ram's horn blast shall resound throughout your land. You shall treat this fiftieth year as sacred. You shall proclaim liberty in the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you, when each of you shall return to your own property, each of you to your own family." (Lev 25:8)

On May 9, 2024, Pope Francis proclaimed the 2025 Ordinary Jubilee through his pontifical bull of indiction named Spes non confundit (Latin for "Hope does not disappoint").

The Holy Doors of the four main basilicas in Rome open during a jubilee year, with Pope Francis himself opening that of St. Peter's Basilica on the eve of Dec 24, 2024. That of the Cathedral Basilica of St. John Lateran followed on Dec 29, of the Basilica of St. Mary Major on Jan 1, and of the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls on Jan 5.

A jubilee year is a special year of forgiveness, restoration, and renewal that has roots in the Old Testament.

In biblical times, it occurred every fifty years (after seven cycles of seven years each, or forty-nine years), and is a year when debts are cancelled, slaves are freed, land is returned to original owners, and no farming is done.

In contemporary times, the jubilee occurs every 25 years (a change made by Pope Paul II in 1475 to increase accessibility), and the Catholic tradition entails a call to the faithful to seek forgiveness and reconciliation and to undertake a pilgrimage to Rome or other designated pilgrimage sites.

On Monday November 10, a group of 48 pilgrims enplaned to Italy in answer to this summons. About 20 members of the group were members of St. Julie Billiart Parish, and the group was led by Fr. Tito Cartagenas, our pastor.

There is something truly special about being in a pilgrimage group such as this. The shared experience of journeying to a faraway land and beholding wondrous places brimming with religious significance, hearing mass together in intimate settings and receiving the sacrament of the Eucharist, partaking of meals together, looking out for one another, sharing what we have with our companions, be it snacks, or pictures, or stories and laughter – these all come together like a crucible, forging bonds that persist long after the return home.

One might say that the highlights of the trip may be summarized in its itinerary — a general audience with Pope Leo XIV, passing through the four Holy Doors, touring the Vatican Museum, seeing secular sites like the Colosseum, Roman Forum, and Trevi Fountain, visiting various places of worship like that in the Benedictine Abbey in Monte Cassino, the Santuario di Santa Maria delle Grazie in San Giovanni Rotondo, the Basilica Santuario di San Michele Arcangelo in Monte Sant'Angelo, the Santuario del Miracolo Eucaristico di Lanciano in Lanciano, the Basilica della Santa Casa in Loreto, the Basilica di San Francesco, Santuario della Spogliazione, and Basilica di Santa Maria degli Angeli in Assisi, and the Duomo di Orvieto in Orvieto, seeing the shrines of saints like St. Benedict, St. Padre Pio, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare and that of the first millennial saint, St. Carlo Acutis, and seeing relics from the time of Christ like wood from the manger, nails and wood from the crucifixion, and the steps from the praetorium of Pontius Pilate on which the Lord was supposed to have walked.

But for several pilgrims, the highlight was something unseen, held closely in our hearts. Many of us travelled to Italy carrying petitions that we sought to elevate in holy places. We held the memories of family members and loved ones who have passed on and offered prayers for their eternal repose. We carried joy in our hearts that came with being faithful to the Lord and sought to share this joy with others.

This pilgrimage was markedly special, happening as it did during a jubilee year, when the grace of a plenary indulgence is granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. To obtain this grace, a pilgrim needed to have detachment from sin, to avail of the sacrament of confession, to receive holy communion, and to pray for the pope's intentions. By this grace, temporal punishment due to sin is removed.


The thought of this indulgence was made especially poignant during the first mass the group attended on the Memorial of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, Virgin, for which the gospel reading leaned into the topic of the end times, the coming on God's kingdom. Fr. Tito's homily touched on the need to prepare ourselves for this finality. Wouldn't the remission of temporal punishment be to us like water on the tip of Lazarus' finger to cool the tongue of the rich man in Hades?

The pilgrimage was a physical journey; it was a spiritual journey. And more than just forging bonds among the participants, it strengthened our bonds to our merciful Lord.
