First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47

The first community of Christians grows as its members meet to pray and break bread.

Responsorial Psalm

Second Reading

We have new hope because of Jesus' Resurrection.

Gospel Reading

John 20:19-31

Thomas believes because he sees Jesus.

Background on the Gospel Reading

The Gospels tell us that Jesus appeared to the disciples on several occasions after they discovered that his tomb was empty. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit but in bodily form. The bodily form was not one that the disciples recognized though. In John's Gospel, Mary of Magdala does not recognize that the figure standing before her is Jesus until he speaks to her. In Luke's Gospel the disciples who meet Jesus on the road to Emmaus do not recognize him until he breaks bread with them. The resurrected Jesus had a physical presence, but the disciples couldn't recognize Jesus unless he allowed them to. His resurrected body, nonetheless, showed the marks of his crucifixion.

From readings such as today's Gospel, we also see that in his resurrected body, Jesus seems to be free of physical constraints. He appears to the disciples despite the fact that the doors were locked.

Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, Jesus commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." During the meeting, Jesus also shows the integral connection between forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The story of Thomas illustrates our Christian experience today: We are called to believe without seeing. In fact, all Christians after the first witnesses have been called to believe without seeing. Thomas's doubt is hardly surprising; the news of Jesus' appearance was incredible to the disciples who had seen him crucified and buried. Thomas's human nature compelled him to want hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death was indeed the same Jesus who had been crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to act on that desire. He is our witness that Jesus is really risen.

Our faith is based on the witness of the Church that has preceded us, beginning with Thomas and the first disciples. Through Baptism we receive the same Holy Spirit that Jesus brought to the first disciples. We are among those who are "blessed" because we believe without having seen.

CONEXIÓN DOMINICAL

Primera lectura: Hechos de los Apóstoles 2:42-47

La primera comunidad de cristianos crece a medida que sus miembros se reúnen para orar y partir el pan.

Salmo responsorial: Salmo 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24

Segunda lectura: 1 Pedro 1:3-9

Tenemos una nueva esperanza gracias a la Resurrección de Jesús.

Lectura del Evangelio: Juan 20:19-31 (Tomás cree porque ve a Jesús.)

Contexto de la lectura del Evangelio

Los Evangelios nos relatan que Jesús se apareció a los discípulos en varias ocasiones después de que estos descubrieran que su tumba estaba vacía. Parte del misterio de la Resurrección de Jesús radica en que se apareció a sus discípulos no como un espíritu, sino en forma corporal. Sin embargo, esa forma corporal no era una que los discípulos reconocieran de inmediato. En el Evangelio de Juan, María Magdalena no reconoce que la figura que tiene ante sí es Jesús hasta que él le habla. En el Evangelio de Lucas, los discípulos que se encuentran con

Jesús en el camino a Emaús no lo reconocen hasta que él parte el pan con ellos. El

Jesús resucitado tenía una presencia física, pero los discípulos no podían reconocer a Jesús a menos que él se lo permitiera. No obstante, su cuerpo resucitado mostraba las marcas de su crucifixión.

A partir de lecturas como el Evangelio de hoy, también observamos que, en su cuerpo resucitado, Jesús parece estar libre de las limitaciones físicas. Se aparece a los discípulos a pesar de que las puertas estaban cerradas con llave.

Jesús saluda a sus discípulos con el don de la paz y el don del Espíritu Santo. Al hacerlo, Jesús encomienda a sus discípulos la misión de continuar la obra que él ha comenzado: «Como el Padre me ha enviado, así también yo los envío a ustedes». Durante este encuentro, Jesús también muestra la conexión intrínseca que existe entre el perdón de los pecados y el don del Espíritu Santo.

La historia de Tomás ilustra nuestra experiencia cristiana actual: estamos llamados a creer sin ver. De hecho, todos los cristianos posteriores a los primeros testigos han sido llamados a creer sin ver.

La duda de Tomás no resulta en absoluto sorprendente; la noticia de la aparición de Jesús resultaba increíble para los discípulos, quienes lo habían visto crucificado y sepultado. La naturaleza humana de Tomás lo impulsó a desear pruebas contundentes de que el Jesús que se apareció a los discípulos después de su muerte era, en efecto, el mismo Jesús que había sido crucificado. A Tomás se le concede la oportunidad de satisfacer ese deseo. Él es nuestro testigo de que Jesús ha resucitado verdaderamente.

Nuestra fe se fundamenta en el testimonio de la Iglesia que nos ha precedido, comenzando por Tomás y los primeros discípulos. A través del Bautismo, recibimos el mismo Espíritu Santo que Jesús trajo a los primeros discípulos. Nos contamos entre aquellos que son «bienaventurados», pues creemos sin haber visto.

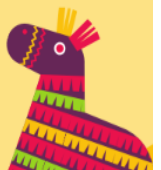

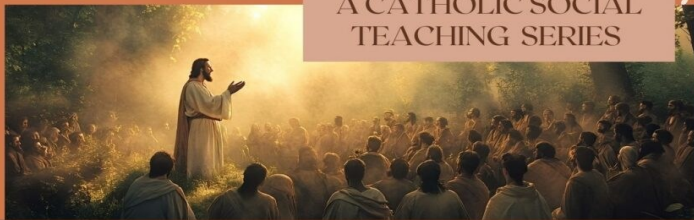
