## SUNDAY CONNECTION

### **First Reading**

Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8,14-17

The people of Samaria accept the Gospel of Jesus proclaimed to them by Philip.

### **Responsorial Psalm**

Psalm 66:1-7,16,20

Sing praise to God, all the earth.

### **Second Reading**

1 Peter 3:15-18

Be ready to give explanation for your hope in Christ.

### **Gospel Reading**

John 14:15-21

Jesus promises his disciples that he will send them another advocate, the Spirit of truth.

### **Background on the Gospel Reading**

Today's Gospel is a continuation of last week's Gospel: Jesus is speaking to his disciples at the Last Supper. In today's reading Jesus offers encouragement to his disciples, who will soon see him crucified. He reassures them that even though he will leave them, he will not abandon them. Instead he will send them the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, through whom the disciples will continue to live in union with Jesus.

Jesus uses the term Advocate to describe the Holy Spirit, whom the disciples will receive. Another word used to describe the Holy Spirit is Paraclete, a legal term meaning "one who offers defense for another." Note that Jesus says that he will send "another Advocate." Jesus himself is the first advocate, interceding for his disciples with the Father.

In today's reading Jesus contrasts his impending departure with the permanence of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus will leave to return to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples.

Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will come to know and appreciate the unity of the Son and the Father. They will also understand that they too participate in the communion between the Father and the Son: "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you" (John 14:20).

Today's reading is one example of the contrast that John's Gospel presents between the community of disciples, to whom God will reveal himself, and the unbelieving world, which will remain in darkness. The unbelieving world cannot accept the "Spirit of truth," whom the disciples will receive. Only through the Spirit will God's revelation and love be known.

### **Antecedentes de la Lectura del Evangelio**

El Evangelio de hoy es una continuación del Evangelio de la semana pasada: Jesús habla a sus discípulos durante la Última Cena. En la lectura de hoy, Jesús ofrece ánimo a sus discípulos, que pronto lo verán crucificado. Les asegura que, aunque los dejará, no los abandonará. En cambio, les enviará al Defensor, el Espíritu Santo, por medio del cual los discípulos continuarán viviendo en unión con Jesús.

Jesús usa el término Defensor para describir al Espíritu Santo, que los discípulos recibirán. Otra palabra que se usa para describir al Espíritu Santo es Paráclito, un término legal que significa "quien ofrece defensa por otro." Nótese que Jesús dice que enviará "otro Abogado." Jesús mismo es el primer abogado, intercediendo por sus discípulos ante el Padre. En la lectura de hoy,

Jesús contrasta su inminente partida con la permanencia del don del Espíritu Santo. Jesús se irá para regresar al Padre, pero el Espíritu Santo permanecerá con los discípulos.

A través del don del Espíritu Santo, los discípulos llegarán a conocer y apreciar la unidad del Hijo y del Padre. También comprenderán que ellos también participan en la comunión entre el Padre y el Hijo: "En aquel día sabrás que yo estoy en mi Padre, y vosotros en mí, y yo en vosotros" (Juan 14:20).

La lectura de hoy es un ejemplo del contraste que presenta el Evangelio de Juan entre la comunidad de discípulos, a quienes Dios se dará a conocer, y el mundo incrédulo, que permanecerá en la oscuridad. El mundo incrédulo no puede aceptar el "Espíritu de la verdad", a quien recibirán los discípulos. Solo a través del Espíritu se conocerán la revelación y el amor de Dios.

# **Our Lady of Fatima**

## **Queen of the Holy Rosary, Mother of Mercy, and Messenger of Peace**

### **The Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima**

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared six times to three shepherd children—Lucia dos Santos (age 10), and her cousins Francisco (age 9) and Jacinta Marto (age 7)—in the Cova da Iria near Fatima, Portugal. These apparitions occurred during World War I, a time of great turmoil and suffering in the world.

Our Lady appeared as a beautiful young woman dressed in white, more brilliant than the sun, holding a rosary. She identified herself as "the Lady of the Rosary" and came with an urgent message for humanity. The children described her as radiating light and speaking with a voice of incomparable sweetness.

During the first apparition on May 13, 1917, Our Lady asked the children if they were willing to offer themselves to God and bear all the sufferings He would send them as an act of reparation for sins and for the conversion of sinners. When they agreed, she promised: "Then you will have much to suffer, but the grace of God will be your comfort."

Our Lady taught the children to pray the Rosary daily for peace in the world and the end of the war. She revealed three secrets to them, which have become known as the Three Secrets of Fatima. She also performed the Miracle of the Sun on October 13, 1917, witnessed by approximately 70,000 people, to confirm the authenticity of her apparitions. The apparitions were officially approved by the Catholic Church in 1930, and Fatima has become one of the most important Marian pilgrimage sites in the world, visited by millions of pilgrims annually.

### **The Message of Fatima**

#### **Prayer and Penance**

Our Lady emphasized the importance of prayer, especially the Rosary, and penance for the conversion of sinners. She asked that the Rosary be prayed daily and that sacrifices be offered for sinners. She taught the children the Fatima Prayer: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy."

#### **The Five First Saturdays**

Our Lady requested that people practice the Five First Saturdays devotion in reparation for sins committed against her Immaculate Heart. This devotion involves going to Confession, receiving Holy Communion, praying five decades of the Rosary, and meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary for fifteen minutes on the first Saturday of five consecutive months.

#### **Consecration to the Immaculate Heart**

Our Lady asked for the consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart, promising that if this request was fulfilled, Russia would be converted and there would be peace. She also asked that all individuals consecrate themselves to her Immaculate Heart. Pope Pius XII consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 1942, and Pope John Paul II specifically consecrated Russia in 1984.

#### **Warning and Promise**

Our Lady warned that if people did not stop offending God, a worse war would break out during the pontificate of Pius XI (World War II). She also warned of the spread of errors from Russia and persecution of the Church. However, she promised: "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, and she will be converted, and a period of peace will be granted to the world."


