SUNDAY CONNECTION

First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-3

The Lord will renew his covenant with the descendents of David.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 145:8-9,15-18

The Lord provides for his people.

Second Reading: Romans 8:35,37-39

Nothing can separate us from the love of God.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 14:13-21

Jesus feeds the crowd with five loaves and two fish.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today we jump ahead in our reading of Matthew's Gospel to Chapter 14. Last week we heard Jesus conclude his discourse with the crowds about the Kingdom of Heaven. In Matthew's narrative, Jesus then leaves the crowds and returns to Nazareth, where he is rejected. Matthew then recounts the story of John the Baptist's arrest and execution at the hands of Herod. Today's Gospel reading begins at this point.

Upon hearing the news of the death of John the Baptist, Jesus seeks to withdraw, but the crowds follow him. Jesus reaches out to them in compassion and heals the sick. At the end of a long day, the disciples encourage Jesus to send the crowds away so that they might find provisions for themselves. Jesus again responds with compassion for the crowd. Jesus tells his disciples to provide food for the crowd. The disciples reply with a report of the meagerness of their own provisions—five loaves and two fish. The result is the very familiar miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. Matthew's Gospel tells us that 5,000 men were fed, and this number does not even include the women and children.

Jesus' blessing brought abundance from the meager provisions of the disciples. In this action, Jesus offers us a sign of the Kingdom of Heaven that he has been teaching about in the parables. A feast results from the smallest of portions—remember the mustard seed and the yeast. In this miracle we witness an example for Christian life and ministry. Even the smallest of offerings can produce abundant results when placed in the service of the Kingdom of Heaven.

We find the story of Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and the fish in each of the four Gospels. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, Jesus performs this same miracle on two separate occasions. The story of this miracle is an anticipation of the Eucharist in which we are fed by the abundant grace of God. The importance of the Eucharist has been a defining element of Christian life from the very beginning.

Jesús alimenta a la multitud con cinco panes y dos peces.

Contexto de la lectura del Evangelio

Hoy avanzamos en la lectura del Evangelio de Mateo hasta el capítulo 14. La semana pasada escuchamos a Jesús concluir su discurso a la multitud sobre el Reino de los Cielos. En la narración de Mateo, Jesús deja entonces a la multitud y regresa a Nazaret, donde es rechazado. A continuación, Mateo relata la historia del arresto y la ejecución de Juan el Bautista a manos de Herodes. La lectura del Evangelio de hoy comienza en este punto.

Al enterarse de la muerte de Juan el Bautista, Jesús intenta retirarse, pero la multitud lo sigue. Jesús se acerca a ellos con compasión y cura a los enfermos. Al final de una larga jornada, los discípulos sugieren a Jesús que despida a la multitud para que puedan buscar provisiones por su cuenta. Jesús responde nuevamente con compasión hacia la multitud y les pide a sus discípulos que les den de comer. Los discípulos responden señalando la escasez de sus propias provisiones: cinco panes y dos peces. El resultado es el muy conocido milagro de la multiplicación de los panes y los peces. El Evangelio de Mateo nos dice que se alimentó a cinco mil hombres, cifra que ni siquiera incluye a las mujeres y a los niños.

La bendición de Jesús hizo surgir la abundancia a partir de las escasas provisiones de los discípulos. Con este gesto, Jesús nos ofrece un signo del Reino de los Cielos, sobre el cual ha estado enseñando a través de las parábolas. Un banquete surge de las porciones más pequeñas; recordemos la semilla de mostaza y la levadura. En este milagro somos testigos de un ejemplo para la vida y el ministerio cristianos. Incluso la más pequeña de las ofrendas puede producir resultados abundantes cuando se pone al servicio del Reino de los Cielos.

Encontramos el relato de la multiplicación de los panes y los peces realizada por Jesús en cada uno de los cuatro Evangelios. En los Evangelios de Marcos y Mateo, Jesús lleva a cabo este mismo milagro en dos ocasiones distintas. La historia de este milagro es una anticipación de la Eucaristía, en la que nos alimentamos de la abundante gracia de Dios. La importancia de la Eucaristía ha sido un elemento definitorio de la vida cristiana desde sus mismos inicios.
