USCCB Call to Prayer and Action for Life

America's Catholic bishops are calling on all faithful to unite in prayer and action through October as abortion rates climb nationwide—driven by the unregulated spread of mail-order chemical abortion pills.

SUNDAY CONNECTION

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9a,11-13a
The Lord appears to Elijah in a whisper.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 85:9-14
The Lord is the source of salvation.

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5
Paul speaks of the blessings that have come to the Israelites.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 14:22-33
Jesus walks on water, and the disciples acknowledge him as the Son of God.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel directly follows last week's account of Jesus feeding a crowd of more than 5,000 people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. For the sake of the crowds, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and then withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in Chapter 8 of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus calms the seas. This time, however, Jesus does not calm the seas, and the disciples do not express fear until they see Jesus walking toward them on the water. In this story it is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for a ghost.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. In continuity with last week's Gospel about the feeding of the multitude, today's Gospel is also about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do. In last week's Gospel, when the disciples see the crowds, they ask Jesus to send the crowds away. Jesus turns the situation around, telling the disciples to feed the crowd with the provisions that they have. Both of these Gospels tell us much about ministry.

Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. He is not a ghost. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him, however, once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches out to Peter and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, Matthew reports that the wind ceases, and the disciples confess that Jesus is the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. Peter walks on water. The five loaves and two fish feed a multitude of people. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah, God's only Son.

Jesús camina sobre el agua y los discípulos lo reconocen como el Hijo de Dios.

Contexto de la Lectura del Evangelio

El Evangelio de hoy sigue directamente el relato de la semana pasada sobre Jesús alimentando a una multitud de más de 5,000 personas con solo cinco panes y dos peces. Por el bien de la multitud, Jesús había pospuesto su tiempo de soledad. Ahora, por fin, Jesús encuentra un momento para la tranquilidad y la oración. Envía a sus discípulos por adelantado en barco, despide a la multitud y luego se retira a la montaña a orar. Los discípulos no lo pasan bien. Les cuesta resistir el viento y las olas, avanzando poco en su viaje. Nos recuerda a una historia anterior en el capítulo 8 del Evangelio de Mateo, cuando Jesús calma los mares. Esta vez, sin embargo, Jesús no calma los mares, y los discípulos no muestran miedo hasta que ven a Jesús caminando hacia ellos sobre el agua. En esta historia no es la tormenta lo que temen, sino la visión de Jesús delante de ellos, a quien confunden con un fantasma.

Pistas como estas sugieren que esta historia trata sobre la comprensión cada vez mayor de los discípulos sobre la identidad de Jesús. En continuidad con el Evangelio de la semana pasada sobre la alimentación de la multitud, el Evangelio de hoy también trata sobre lo que la fe de los discípulos en Jesús les permitirá hacer. En el Evangelio de la semana pasada, cuando los discípulos ven a las multitudes, le piden a Jesús que las despida. Jesús da vuelta a la situación, diciéndoles a los discípulos que alimenten a la multitud con lo que tienen. Ambos Evangelios nos dicen mucho sobre el ministerio.

Jesús llama a los discípulos y calma sus miedos. Él no es un fantasma. El impulsivo Pedro busca pruebas de que la persona es realmente Jesús. Le pide a Jesús que lo llame a caminar sobre el agua, y Jesús concede esta petición. Sin embargo, el miedo y la duda de Pedro lo superan una vez que está caminando sobre el agua. Jesús extiende la mano a Pedro y lo salva. Cuando Jesús y Pedro entran en la barca, Mateo informa que el viento cesa, y los discípulos confiesan que Jesús es el Hijo de Dios. La fe en Jesús permitirá a los discípulos hacer la obra que Jesús ha hecho. Pedro camina sobre el agua. Los cinco panes y dos peces alimentan a una multitud de personas. Los discípulos pueden y participarán en la obra del reino de los cielos. Sin embargo, cuando Pedro teme y duda de la persona de Jesús, flaquea. El ejemplo de Pedro nos enseña que el verdadero ministerio cristiano surge de la fe en que Jesús es el Mesías, el único Hijo de Dios.
