SUNDAY CONNECTION

First Reading

Isaiah 22:19-23

God will remove Shebna from his office as master of the palace.

Responsorial Psalm

Gospel Reading

Matthew 16:13-20

Simon Peter acknowledges Jesus as the Christ and is given the key to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Background on the Gospel Reading

It is important to read today's Gospel and next week's Gospel as two parts of a single story. These readings are a turning point in Matthew's Gospel. This week we hear Jesus name Simon Peter as the rock upon which he will build his Church. Next week we will hear Jesus call this same Simon Peter "Satan" when he reacts negatively to Jesus' prediction about his passion and death.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples what people are saying about his identity. The disciples indicate that most people believe that Jesus is a prophet of Israel. Then Jesus asks his disciples who they believe that he is. Simon Peter answers, identifying Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.

Jesus commends Simon Peter for this profession of faith, indicating that this insight has come from God. Because of Simon Peter's response, Jesus calls him the "rock" upon which Jesus will build the Church. This is a word play on the name Peter, which is the Greek word for "rock." Peter is then given special authority by Jesus, a symbolic key to the Kingdom of Heaven. Peter will play an important role in the early Christian community as a spokesperson and a leader.

In today's Gospel, Peter's recognition of Jesus' identity is credited to a revelation by God. This will contrast sharply with Jesus' rebuke of Peter in next week's Gospel. When Peter rejects Jesus' prediction of his passion and death, Peter is said to no longer be thinking as God does but as humans do.

The use of the term church in today's Gospel is one of only three such occurrences in Matthew's Gospel. Peter in this Gospel is being credited as the foundation for the Church, a privilege granted to him because of his recognition of Jesus' identity. The Church continues to be grounded in the faith that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Contexto de la lectura del Evangelio

Es importante leer el Evangelio de hoy y el de la próxima semana como dos partes de una misma historia. Estas lecturas marcan un punto de inflexión en el Evangelio de Mateo. Esta semana escuchamos a Jesús designar a Simón Pedro como la roca sobre la cual edificará su Iglesia. La próxima semana escucharemos a Jesús llamar «Satanás» a ese mismo Simón Pedro cuando este reacciona negativamente ante el anuncio de Jesús sobre su pasión y muerte.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús pregunta a sus discípulos qué dice la gente sobre su identidad. Los discípulos señalan que la mayoría de las personas cree que Jesús es un profeta de Israel. Luego, Jesús pregunta a sus discípulos quién creen ellos que es él. Simón Pedro responde identificando a Jesús como el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios.

Jesús elogia a Simón Pedro por esta profesión de fe, señalando que tal revelación proviene de Dios. Debido a la respuesta de Simón Pedro, Jesús lo llama la "roca" sobre la cual edificará la Iglesia. Se trata de un juego de palabras con el nombre Pedro, que en griego significa "roca". Jesús otorga entonces a Pedro una autoridad especial: una llave simbólica del Reino de los Cielos. Pedro desempeñará un papel importante en la comunidad cristiana primitiva como portavoz y líder.

En el Evangelio de hoy, el reconocimiento que hace Pedro de la identidad de Jesús se atribuye a una revelación de Dios. Esto contrasta marcadamente con la reprensión de Jesús a Pedro en el Evangelio de la próxima semana. Cuando Pedro rechaza el anuncio de Jesús sobre su pasión y muerte, se dice que ya no piensa como Dios, sino como los hombres.

El uso del término «Iglesia» en el Evangelio de hoy es una de las tres únicas veces que aparece en el Evangelio de Mateo. En este pasaje, se reconoce a Pedro como el fundamento de la Iglesia, un privilegio que se le concede por haber reconocido la identidad de Jesús. La Iglesia sigue cimentada en la fe de que Jesucristo es el Señor.

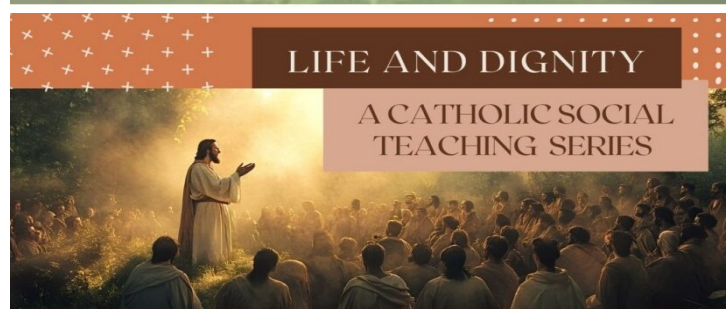
