

Description

To foster the Holy Spirit's renewal of our diocese, we, the Diocese of San José, will deepen the faithful's understanding of the Eucharist as the Source and Summit of our faith. As the primary way most people experience the Church, Masses must fully express this truth. True communion with God and with each other demands that we, as a diocese, put our best efforts into helping the People of God experience the presence of Christ in Word and Sacrament. This includes joyful music, meaningful homilies, and a sense of generously being welcomed. This priority will dovetail with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB's) three-year Eucharistic Revival.

Description

To foster the Holy Spirit's renewal of our diocese, we, the Diocese of San José, will focus on the needs of Santa Clara County youth¹6 (ages 11-18) and young adults¹7 (ages 18-35). These young people are not just the future; they're the energetic present of our Church, ready to spread Jesus's message of love and hope. Yet it is disturbing that 85% of Catholic youth disengage from their faith by age 25¹8. Thus, we are committed to walking with young people as they develop their relationship with Jesus Christ, discover that God does have a plan for them, and experience the deep joy and peace that are found in embracing His plan. To address this, we will develop a comprehensive youth and young adult ministry across our diocese, parishes, and schools that are To, With, By, and For youth and young adults, making a real difference in their lives and the lives of those around them.

- 2. Personally invite and engage youth and young adults through spiritual activities and meaningful social and service opportunities
