

Crestwood Neighborhood Association  
Special Informational Meeting  
Monday, June 1, 2026

Meeting called to order at 7:10pm.

A quorum was not necessary as this was an informational meeting by the City to up-date the Association regarding the water and sewer lines.

City staff present: Christopher Harder, Mary Hannah, Mary Gugliuzza, Clayton Torrance and Donald Watson.

Mr. Harder opened the presentation addressing the many water main breaks, especially during the 2021 winter storm, that occurred in Crestwood and that it was unacceptable. Since 2025, many of the water and sewer lines have been replaced and the streets repaved. As temporary lines were being place on North Bailey, it was found the temporary lines were contaminated and an emergency water replaced the contaminated lines. Since this meeting, the lines have been flushed and the new mains will be tested and pass inspection. He was hopeful the transfer would be completed by June 12.

The contractor is currently working on curbing that was destroyed by contractor equipment. The street repair will start in June and extend to mid-February 2027. The contractor will pulverize 11 inches deep, stabilize with an 8 inch base with lime followed by an overlay with 3 inches of asphalt. Mr. Harder stated the new roads will last 15 – 20 years. Website – Brett Yanoski is re-designing the website and will be ready by the end of July. Damage to the fence in the park has been reported to the Parks Department for repair.

Treasurer Report: Amy Vonsavage reported the Association is on target for the 2026 budget. It is always helpful to have more dues paying members.

- Amy Vonsavage reported the Association is ready for the parade and picnic. Meet at Joe Kelly School at 9:45am on July 4<sup>th</sup>, parade from the school down Eastwood Drive due to the construction to North Bailey to the park followed by hot dog with all the

fixings, Kona Ice and our very own Crestwood Pickers. We will sadly miss Frank Diaz as our head hotdog chef.

- Halloween in the Park Before Dark will take place on October 31 in Crestwood Park.

City Up-dates:

- Wesley Kirk spoke about the Fort Worth Floodplain Management meeting regarding the flood plains.
- Wesley Kirk spoke about the Westside Village and White Settlement traffic study The police have conducted radar speed studies for the increased traffic and speed on White Settlement, especially at the curve by the cleaners. No real high speeds were noted.
- No updates on the Crestwood Apartments. Management is accepting new leases.
