Each receive a unique bowl to take home as a powerful reminder of all the empty bowls in the community. In an effort to adjust to the "new normal" this year, guests had the option to purchase tickets online and participate in an extraordinary drivethrough and online virtual experience. Each ticket provided one pint of soup from our local amazing restaurants and fresh-baked bread from Old School Bakery, as well as other sponsored goodies in an insulated cooler bag.

Palm Beach County Food Bank 2020 Annual Report



When COVID-19 hit our nation in March, life here in Palm Beach County turned upside-down. In just two weeks, schools, businesses, and restaurants closed their doors. Except for frontline and essential workers, we all moved into isolation, hoping and praying that the pandemic would end quickly.

But as the months stretched on, our community has come together to survive one of the most challenging crises we've ever experienced. Food insecurity has surged beyond what we could have ever expected ... and yet friends and partners like you have stepped forward with remarkable commitment.

Together, we've served 3 times more hungry people this year than ever before!

Each person you've helped serve has a name, has a story, and has HOPE, thanks to you. Here are a few of their stories*:

FOLD

"I've been struggling with very serious medical issues for years, like congestive heart failure and COPD. That means I'm at high risk for COVID-19, so my doctor has kept me in isolation at home since March. I haven't been able to work, so I can barely afford my medication, much less food every month.

I was so afraid. But then I heard about PBCFB and reached out for help. Through a food pantry in my neighborhood, they've made sure I have healthy food to eat. I used to go hungry sometimes, but now I have enough every single day. It's like a miracle. I don't know what I would do without them." – Lucille

"When COVID-19 happened, I lost both of my waitressing jobs. I'm a single mom, and I've always done everything I have to do to make sure my kids have what they need. It's hard to talk about, but there's nothing like knowing you're putting your kids to bed hungry. They tried to be so brave. But my heart just broke.

I couldn't believe it when I heard that PBCFB was providing free food—good food, the kind of food my kids really needed. I started going to this drive-by food pantry, and they'd give me enough groceries for a whole week at a time. My kids were so excited. They learned to help me cook! Now, I have a good job working for a medical company at home. I can't wait until I've saved up enough to give back. You were there for us when we needed you." — Jaslyn

The Harsh Reality of 2020

- More than 300,000 people in Palm Beach County don't know where they'll get their next meal.
- 60,000 children and 60,000 senior adults are currently food insecure.
- PBC is the 10th largest school district in the U.S., and 60% of our school-aged children qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. Those meals are often the only food they eat each day.
- The unemployment rate in Palm Beach County is TRIPLE what it was in 2019.
- Grocery prices have increased an average of 3.5% due to pandemic supply disruptions.

Volunteers and Donors: The 2020 Heroes of PBCFB

This year, like every year, we must remember the phenomenal volunteers who choose to share their precious time and energy fighting hunger in our community. These men and women are the driving force against food insecurity, standing strong against hunger on a daily basis.

When schools quickly closed in March, the more than six in ten children who depend on free or reduced-



price breakfast and lunch lost access to this vital source of food.

Many school districts created plans to provide meals as a drive-up service, but thousands of children simply didn't have access to this critical food source.

Lois Pope, one of our longtime volunteers and donors, stepped in with an immediate \$1 million donation to

fill that food gap ... and because she wholeheartedly believes in the joy of serving together, she also created a \$50,000 Social Media Match. Every time someone liked or shared one of her posts about the PBCFB or Lois' Food4Kids program, Lois donated \$1. Together, our friends and partners met the match and raised awareness for hunger in our area!

Lois shared, "No child should go hungry, here in Palm Beach County or anywhere else in this country. You and I have a responsibility to ensure that the children in our community have access to nutritious meals on a daily basis, especially when schools are closed. Frankly, we don't know what will happen next because of the pandemic, so we need to be prepared. Please, join me in this vitally important effort!"

THANK YOU for Feeding Hungry Neighbors

In 2020, the Palm Beach County Food Bank operated these programs with a network of almost 200 partner agencies. Together, we provided critical access to food for more than 300,000 individuals in need every month.

Food Recovery and Distribution: We collected, recovered, and distributed more than II million pounds of food AT NO COST to our community partner agencies like pantries, soup kitchens, and residential facilities in Palm Beach County.

Lois' Food4Kids: Our year-round weekend feeding program expanded to feed more than 1,200 children at 17 different sites every day, filling the nutritional gaps left by closed schools and less-accessible school feeding programs.

Benefits Outreach: We assisted more than 7,000 individuals and families in applying for federal food assistance benefits, which has become increasingly important with the job loss created by COVID-19.
