Grade 2-5 students created circuit activities for the grade F-1 class.

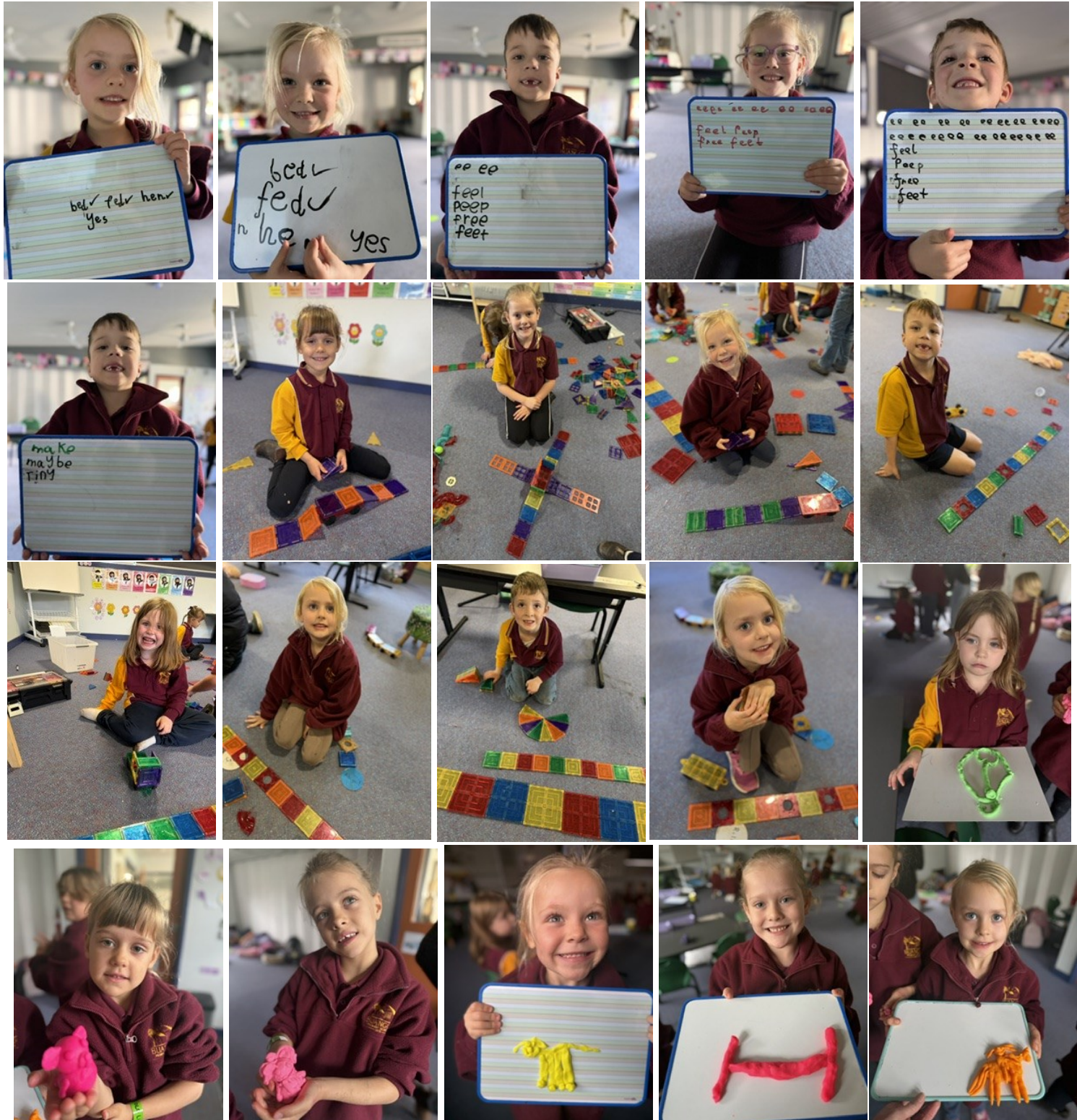


Buangor Primary School is committed to child safety (Ministerial Order No. 870) and takes all reasonable steps to ensure that the safety of our students is paramount.

In maths, we are exploring patterns and have started creating our own patterns using various materials.

This term we will be undertaking Indigenous studies and will be learning the actions to a children's version of the Acknowledgment of Country. We will be discussing the lands on which Buangor Primary School sits and how habit is special and how we can take care of it.

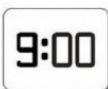
EVERY MINUTE COUNTS ...
