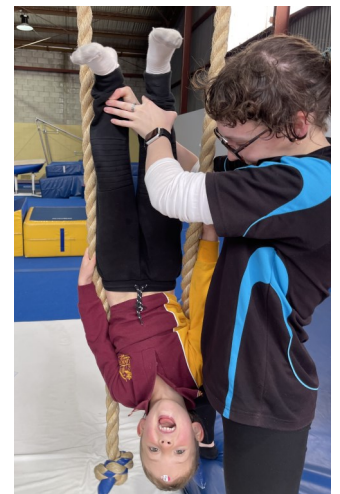
Concert
