New Zealand Trip

Just a reminder that I have my study tour to New Zealand next week. We are travelling to small rural schools. Our purpose and intent are:

- **1. Observing Best Practices:** Gaining insights into New Zealand's education system, teaching methodologies, cluster and leadership approaches.
- **2. Exploring Curriculum & Pedagogy:** Understanding the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) and its focus on student-centered learning, inquiry-based approaches, and cultural responsiveness.
- **3. Leadership Development:** Learning from school leadership models, governance structures, and professional development programs for principals and teachers.
- **4. Incorporating Māori & Pasifika Perspectives:** Understanding how New Zealand integrates Māori and Pasifika cultures into education through the Treaty of Waitangi principles, Te Reo Māori language programs, and inclusive practices.
- **5. Enhancing Student Well-being & Inclusion:** Observing initiatives related to student well-being, mental health support, special education, and inclusive learning environments.
- **6. Technology & Innovation in Education:** Exploring the use of digital tools, e-learning platforms, and modern classroom technology to enhance student engagement. Particular interest in any Virtual Learning models..
- **7. Networking & Collaboration:** Building professional relationships with New Zealand educators, school leaders, and policymakers for future partnerships and knowledge exchange.
- **8. Assessing School Governance & Policies:** Understanding the role of school boards, community involvement, and policy frameworks that support school autonomy and accountability. Particular interest in how small rural schools are funded.
- **9.** Evaluating Outdoor & Experiential Learning: Learning how New Zealand schools incorporate outdoor education, environmental sustainability, and hands-on learning experiences.
- **10. Exploring Vocational & Future-Focused Education:** Observing how schools prepare students for future careers through vocational training, career guidance, and pathways to tertiary education.

The F-2 students have had such a blast over the last two weeks with book week and the Landcare cluster day. The children learnt about trees and their roots. They also dressed up as their favourite book characters and completed fun Book Week activities. In Maths, the children have been working on increasing their speed with friends of ten with some progressing to friends of 100 and beyond.



Landcare Cluster Day

On Monday, the whole school went down to Rocky Point for a Landcare cluster day. When we got there, we did a short bush walk to get to the activities for the day. The activities were based around trees and tree health. We split into groups and chose a tree to work with for the day. For the first activity, we had a pile of sticks to map out tree roots to little white flags. On the little white flags, there were amounts of water or minerals that we would use to make our tree thrive. For the second activity, we learnt about fungus and how they make the tree grow better. We went back to our tree and did the same activity

as the first, except we used bark to symbolise the fungus. When we finished, we figured out how much more the fungus helps the trees. For our last activity, we played a game where there were trees, pests and savers. The pests would go around and tap trees to kill them, while the savers would give the live trees coloured balls so pests couldn't get them. Over all everyone had a great time.
