F-2 CLASSROOM

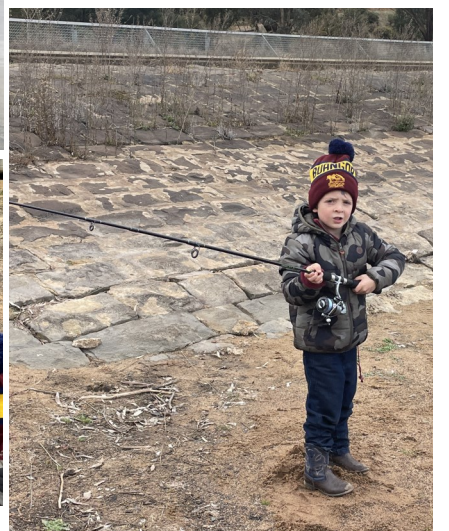
