#### **New Zealand Study Tour**

Our study trip to New Zealand was last week. Our group consisted of 20 principals, two CEP members and one principal from NZ. We visited a variety of rural schools where we were welcomed with open arms and had the chance to learn about their schools where the school systems are different from ours in numerous ways.

Their schooling begins at 5 years of age. There are usually two intakes per term—so students as soon as the students turn 5 they can join an intake throughout the year. Their primary schools usually go to year 8 and then they begin high school. They have area schools which are from aged 5 to 19.

We visited a specialist school which runs classes in mainstream schools where the students integrate with mainstream students. The specialist school system supports their students beyond school too (until they turn 21). They have support officers that help students with their choice of career/further learning after leaving high school.

The other schools we visited integrated their Māori culture extremely well, from traditional welcomes, customs, dance and song. Most of the schools we visited taught Māori language. They have a tight relationship with Elders in the community and are closely monitored by and work in unison with their Māori community to deliver authentic, traditional culture. They are very proud of their Māori heritage.

There was a focus on embracing and working with their environment. They had designated areas for environmental play, such as building tree houses and creating huts in the natural environment, they were even allowed to climb trees.
