SCHOOL-HOME CONNECTIONS

One of our goals at Buangor is to strengthen our school-home connections. We have decided one way to assist this connection is to let you know, more frequently, what your child/ren is/ are doing at school and where the growth they are making. We would like to use Seesaw for this as it is familiar, easy and safe.

Seesaw is a digital portfolio in which students can create, share and reflect on work with their teachers and family.

Students will be able to use creative tools to do things such as draw, take pictures and record videos to capture learning in their portfolio. Teachers will be able to set and assess activities and provide feedback on other student-led work. Student work and feedback can then be shared with parents and carers.

Parents will only be able to see work tagged with their child's name and posts the teacher tags with 'Everyone'. They will also be able to see feedback from the teacher about their child's work and any replies from their child.

We have assessed the value and security of this software with guidance from the Department of Education and Training. Our staff are aware of how to use the software appropriately and how to help your child use it safely.

3-6 CLASSROOM

Civics and Civilization - Voting

The 3-6 class have begun learning about Civics and Civilization. As a start they looked at commonly used words when talking about Civics and Civilization and researched the meanings behind them such as 'democracy' to further assist their understanding. Later the class learnt about Australian values and what it means to have a voice and also how we differ from other countries. Most recently they have been learning about voting, why we vote, who votes and who the AEC is.

Maths

Dear parents, carers and guardians

Buangor Primary School has decided to use Seesaw at the school.

We have assessed the value and security of this software with guidance from the Department of Education and Training. Our staff are aware of how to use the software appropriately and how to help your child use it safely.

Your child will have access to this system and start using it this term.

What Seesaw will be used for:

Seesaw is a digital portfolio in which students can create, share and reflect on work with their teachers and family.

Students can use creative tools to do things such as draw, take pictures and record videos to capture learning in their portfolio. They can complete activities set by their teacher but also drive their own learning by creating and sharing work and comments.

Teachers can find or create activities to assign to their students. Once completed, teachers can assess and provide feedback on student work. They can also communicate with families via private messages, if parents choose to communicate this way.

Families can see and comment on student work tagged with their child's name and posts the teacher tags with 'Everyone'. Families will also be able to see any comment made by another user on their child's posts.

Family members cannot access any other student's content.

The benefits of using Seesaw include:

helping parents engage with their child's learning

helping teachers communicate with parents about student learning.

What personal information will be collected and why:

Seesaw collects and uses information about students and parents in order to register them as users and to allow you and your child to use the software effectively. The following table tells you what information is collected and for what purpose.

In addition to the above, and where appropriate or permitted by law, school staff or service providers may access information in this software for other purposes, for example, when the service provider provides technical support.

How do we protect personal and other information?

We will ensure that information is handled in accordance with the school's policies including: Schools' Privacy Policy, Cybersafety and Responsible Use of Digital Technologies and Digital Learning in Schools. These will be used to explain to the school community how we expect online learning systems, including Seesaw, to be used at school and at home.

We will manage your child's information including how it is stored and how long it is kept, in accordance with the Department's Records Management Policy for schools.

We will help your child to use Seesaw safely by providing them with technical or any other assistance they require. You can also assist by having conversations with your child about eSafety and by ensuring that your child is comfortable raising any issues with you and their teacher.

We recommend that parents monitor their child when learning from home and contact the school if they have any concerns relating to the use of Seesaw.
