3-6 CLASSROOM

It has been a very few weeks in the 3-6 classroom. The first week was science week. We signed up for a few webinars throughout the week and began our Monday with Arludo, a computer game programming company. The students were able to give their ideas to some games designers to put into the games that were created that day. Next on the Tuesday, we had an information webinar called Beneath the Sea. This seminar taught the students all about drones that venture into the sea to research different and difficult places to reach. Wednesday, we invited the F-2 class to join us for the Foldable Flight webinar with Questacon. This was as it sounded, making and testing paper aeroplanes. The students began with an A4 piece of paper and folded it into a paper plane instructed by Questacon. We then tested the planes



and made alterations in order to change the patterns on how they would fly. Our second activity for Wednesday was a Kahoot quiz with SciFest. Raven was our top scorer of the class who came 11th out of more than 200 students! Thursday was the Scienceworks excursion in Melbourne. Many of the students were tuckered out by the end of the trip, but all had an absolute ball.

This week has been book week! To start off the 3-6 class we had a webinar with the Author Lian Tanner. The students agreed she was quite quirky but had some lovely advice for future writers from her many years of experience. Tuesday, the students had a short writing webinar where they did some of their own planning and writing then also shared some of their ideas to the host of the webinar to share with all the other schools watching. On Thursday we had a webinar with Kristin Darell who spoke to the students about her Footy Fever book series. She shared her tips and tricks when creating fun and interesting characters and then instructed the students to create their own special football teams. Later on Thursday, we had another webinar called 'Put Yourself in the Picture'.



This was directed to the artists and illustrators in the room as we explored ideas and practices used by artists representing different beliefs, views and opinions. The students had a great time drawing and learning new techniques when creating their artworks.

Around all the science and book week webinars, the 3-6 class have continued their learning around 'time' in maths. The students have had a large focus on converting from 12-hour to 24-hour time, durations and ordering these times. Another important learning focus during the maths sessions has been students sharing with one another and educating others with their own strategies.







