**The Secret Parade Medieval Tile Workshops – Led by Nancy Isherwood
Monday 6th & Thursday 9th July 2026 – Meet at 10.30 Brunswick MC Hall**

Artist Chris Folwell is coordinating these special tilemaking workshops, inviting groups to make special character tiles ahead of the Novum festival. The tiles will be used to mark a special trail around the city, marking 'paths less trodden to reveal the medieval city beneath modern day Newcastle'. The tiles produced in the workshops will make Brunswick Place their home, and form part of a 'Secret Parade' of miniature figures in full medieval pageantry, reflecting both who has been on the site historically and who is here now. They will be part of the secret trail this summer and remain in place afterwards as part of Explore's city centre home.

**'Treasure: Hidden, Lost, Found' Tour with Andrew Parkin – Led by Kath Smith

Museum, 1st Floor (rear of building)**

Andrew Parkin, Keeper of Archaeology at GNM: Hancock will give us a personal tour of the archaeological finds in the fascinating 'Treasure' exhibition; Roman coins, Viking Age silver, and a buried stash of Tudor coins, all hidden for centuries and found in the North of England.

Featuring extraordinary finds from the British Museum, National Museum of Scotland, Vindolanda, and the Great North Museum: Hancock's own collection, this is your chance to discuss what makes an item valuable, who owns the past, and why buried history matters.

**'Everyday Elegance' Exhibition with Dr Tullia Fraser – Led by Helen Watson
Friday 7th August 2026 – Meet 11.00 at Durham Oriental Museum Entrance**

Dr Tullia Fraser, assistant curator of the Huang Kam Chak Yee Collection, will give us a personal guided tour of the 'Everyday Elegance' exhibition, which explores the daily lives of ordinary women who lived in urban communities in China during the Late Qing period (1800-1912). The show marks the public debut of the Huang Kam Chak Yee Collection, and includes wooden cake moulds, gilt lacquer boxes, silver hair pins and beautifully intricate embroidered clothing. These functional, elegant and revealing items, tell us how women lived; what they did for work and for leisure, how they dressed and what they ate, and how they expressed their individuality. Car shares are encouraged (please let Helen know if you can offer a lift or need one) however the museum is a bus ride or approx. 40mins walk from Durham Station.

Dunston Staithes Tour with TWBPT – Led by Karen Gammack
Thursday 3rd September 2026 – Meet at 10.30 West end of Staithes

Dunston Staithes on the South Side of the Tyne is believed to be the largest timber structure in Europe. It was opened in 1893 by the North Eastern Railway Company and at its height, 5.5m tonnes of coal a year was taken by rail from the Durham coalfields and loaded from the staithes onto ships waiting on the river, which transported coal around the British Isles and Internationally. More recently it has become a popular nature and birdwatching spot, as the mudflats and salt marshes surrounding the structure provide a sheltered haven for wildlife, including curlews, lapwings, otters and even seals. Come along to enjoy a guided tour of the Staithes, learn more about the structure and its history and maybe even spot some feathers and fur in the surrounding landscape.

TWBPT advise that the visit is suitable for all and that there is wheelchair accessible entry for bottom and top deck via Saltmarsh Gardens. Please note that there are steps between the two decks however so this might vary the route.

There is parking opposite at Dunston Excelsior Club, NE11 9DR. For bus routes visit [Travel North East](#) (you might want to consider buses from Gateshead Metro Interchange if more convenient)

Meet at the West end of the Staithes ready to start at 10.30am. There is a £3 charge payable on the day to TWBPT – this goes towards the ongoing restoration and care of the structure.
